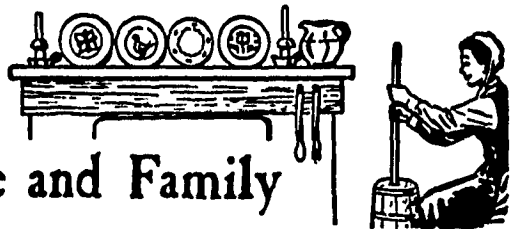

a preheated moderate oven (350 degrees) 25 to 30 minutes. Remove from the oven and spread surface with marshmallow creme. Sprinkle nuts on top. Return to the oven for 1 or 2 minutes longer. Cool. Store in pan, covered tightly with plastic food wrap. Makes 24 bars.

About Can Openers

Clean can openers, both manual and electric, often

Cleaning can openers helps the cutter remain sharp longer.

You can't open rimless cans like those which contain evaporated milk, with an electric can opener

Even if you have an electric can opener, it's a good idea to keep a manual one around for use in special situations.

Several Methods To Tenderize Meat

Commercial meat tenderizers are available at grocery stores. You put the tenderizer on meat at cooking time. Avoid using an excess of these products because they will change the meat texture completely.

The meat cutter may tenderize the meat for you similar to the home method.

The processor that kills the animal may inject a tenderizer into the animal before it is slaughtered. Such meat is usually sold under a trade name.

Tenderizing machines or hand pounding will also tenderize meat.

Only less tender cuts of meat need to be tenderized to reduce cooking time.

Tips On Bathing Suit Care

Whether your swimsuit is made of cotton, synthetic, or

wool fiber, read the label and follow care directions given by the manufacturer. If your suit doesn't have a label, remember these tips:

Today's brightly colored suits are resistant to strong sunlight but will fade or discolor if not rinsed or washed after each wearing to remove salt, chlorine, perspiration, suntan creams, and oils that get into and remain in the fibers.

After a suit is dry, avoid exposing it to sunlight.

Suds suits made of wool gently in lukewarm water and mild soap and line dry them in the shade.

You can wash suits of synthetic fibers in an automatic washer using a short three-minute cycle.

You can tumble dry suits made of elastic fibers in an automatic dryer at low-heat setting about ten to fifteen minutes.

Line dry suits elasticized with rubber or with a rubber-paddling. If the bra section is removable, you can wash it by hand.

What To Look For When Buying Cucumbers

Look for cucumbers with a good green color and firm over the entire length.

Cucumbers may have some white or greenish white color and still be of top quality.

Good cucumbers typically have many small bumps on their surface.

Select those that are well shaped but not too large in diameter.

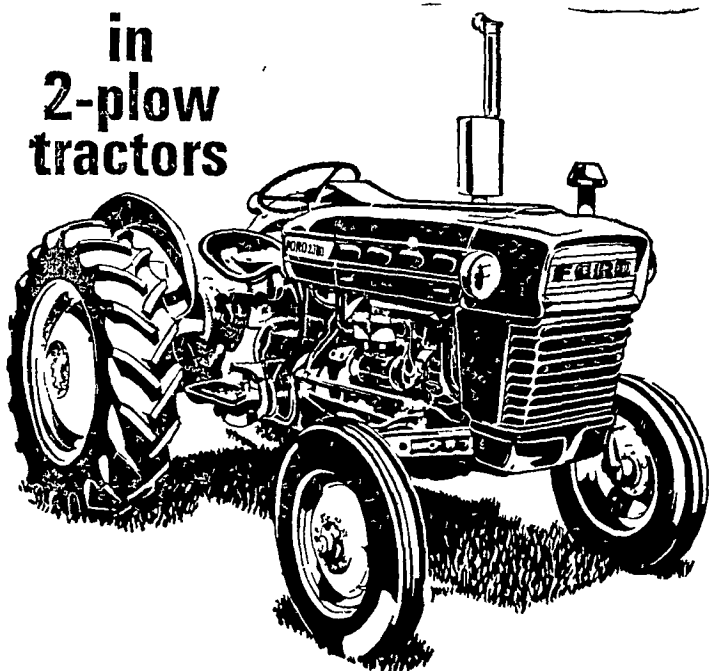
