

State Turkey Calling Contest Is Scheduled

The fourth annual Pennsylvania State Turkey Calling Contest will be held Saturday, August 24, starting at 1:30 p.m. as one of the closing activities of the Franklin County Fair which is sponsored by the Franklin County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs.

The site of the competition is the Chambersburg Rod and Gun

Club, located southwest of Chambersburg on Route 995 near Williamson.

Interest in the art of calling wild turkeys picked up considerably this year when the Pennsylvania Game Commission instituted the first spring gobbler season in the Keystone State. During the spring season, hunting is by calling only.

Judges for this year's contest

will be Eugene Nelson, superintendent of the Pa. Game Commission's State Wild Turkey Farm near Williamsport; Dr. Roger Latham, outdoor editor of the Pittsburgh Press; and William Britton, retired chief enforcement officer of the Pa. Fish Commission.

There is no entry fee, and everyone is eligible to compete except those who have won two years in succession; the latter are again eligible after a one-year waiting period.

Competitive trap shooting for cash prizes will be held in conjunction with the contest.

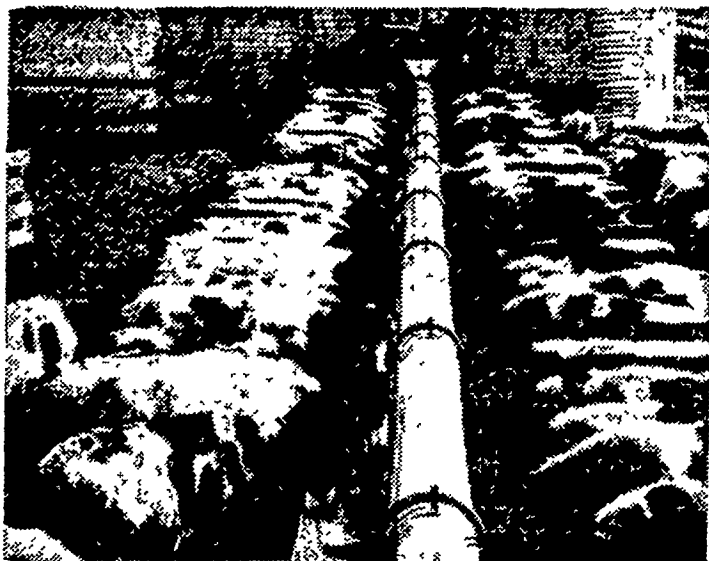

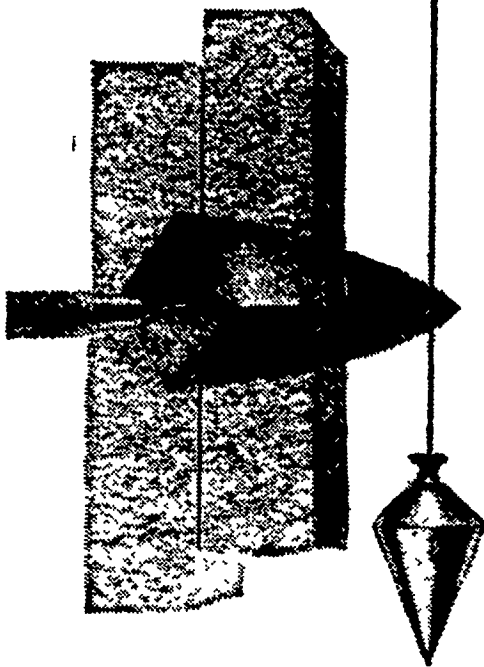

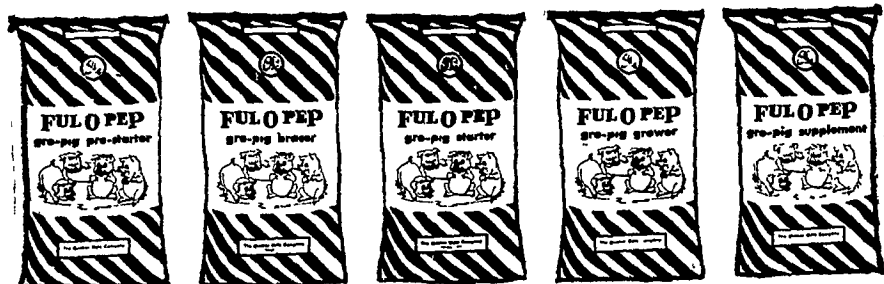
