Pennsylvania's 1968 tobacco crop is forecast at 38 million pounds, based on July 1 conditions. This level indicates a 2% drop from 1967 and would be 23% below the five-year (1962-66) average, according to the State Crop Reporting Service. Tobacco acreage in the state

continues to decline and is now estimated at 20,000 acres, the smallest since 1934. Expected yield per acre this year is 1,900 pounds.
