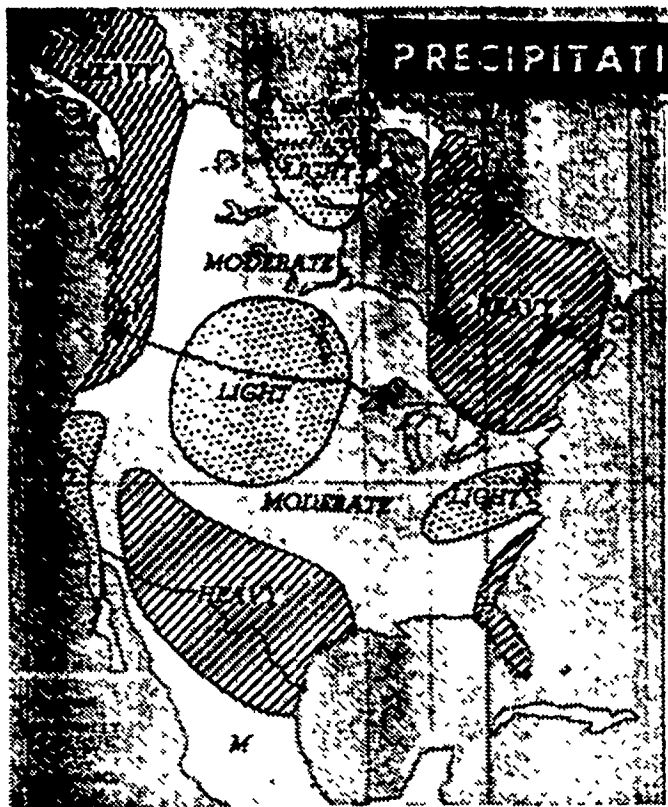
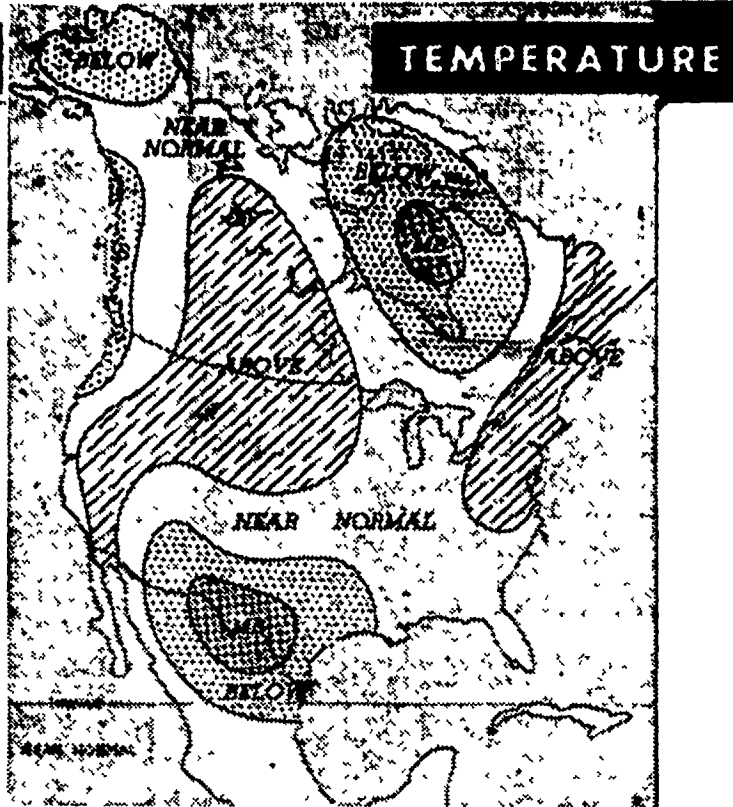


Average Monthly Weather Outlook

WEATHER BUREAU EXTENDED FORECAST DIVISION
FOR MID-JULY TO MID-AUGUST 1968



PRECIPITATION is expected to exceed normal in the North and South Atlantic Coast States, the North Pacific Coast, and from the Southern Plateau eastward to the West Gulf Coast Region. Sub-normal precipitation is indicated for the Middle Atlantic Coast States, central portions of the Appalachians, and the Northern Plains, while little or no rainfall is expected over California. In unspecified areas near normal rainfall is anticipated.



TEMPERATURES are expected to average above seasonal normals in the Northeast as well as over most of the Northern and Central Plains and the Great Basin. Below normal temperatures are indicated for the North Pacific Coast and also for the Southern Plateau, the Southern Plains and the West Gulf Coast Region. Elsewhere near normal temperatures are in prospect.

In the afternoon program, M. M. Smith, County Agent, answered questions that recently came into the Extension office such as "Shall I plant crown vetch for livestock?" Smith said, "I don't think we are ready to use it yet but in the future it might become useful."

On spraying for European corn borer, the county agent said the recommendation is the same as before, that the damage is not sufficient to pay for the spray.

With the low price of wheat, Smith has been receiving many questions on the feeding of this grain to livestock and dairy animals. He said, "You can feed wheat to any livestock except horses." In fact, the agent said you should consider feeding it in light of the low selling price. "It should be cracked or ground," he said.

Other items covered by Smith were recommendations on eradicating animal parasites and record keeping of pesticide use.

The guest speaker, William L. Conyngham, National Director and operator of Hillside Farms, near Wilkes-Barre, told the group of several highlights of the recent National Holstein Convention, including a new director for Pennsylvania (Obie Snyder); and the new fee rates to go into effect October 1.

Other speakers on the program included the new Dairy Princess, Debbie Binkley; Elvin Hess Jr., State Director and Victor Plastow, Associate County Agent.

Hereford State Field Day Set For York County

The Pennsylvania Hereford Association has announced plans for a state-wide field day to be held at Kohr Farms, York, on Saturday, August 10.

The day's activities will be devoted to "increasing profits from beef cattle through a more thorough understanding of the business," according to Ron Kohr of the host farm and vice-president of the Association.

"In addition to a beef cattle judging contest, open to individuals and teams, there will be leading beef cattle authorities discussing the most important economical aspects of the business," Kohr added.

The day's program will begin with a weight-guessing contest at 9:30 A.M., to be followed by a judging contest.

"Due to the interest among juniors for an organization of their own in which they can promote and improve their Herefords, initial steps for the formation of a Pennsylvania Junior Hereford Association sometime in the near future will be dis-

cussed by Dewey Rounds of the American Hereford Association staff in Kansas City," Kohr said.

Selecting herd sires and replacement females will be discussed by Dave Brower, manager of Still House Hollow Farm, Hume, Virginia, and Bart Glass, Cold Springs, New York.

Art Linton, Kansas City, Director of Total Performance Records program for the American Hereford Association will discuss the importance of keeping accurate and complete records for herd improvement.

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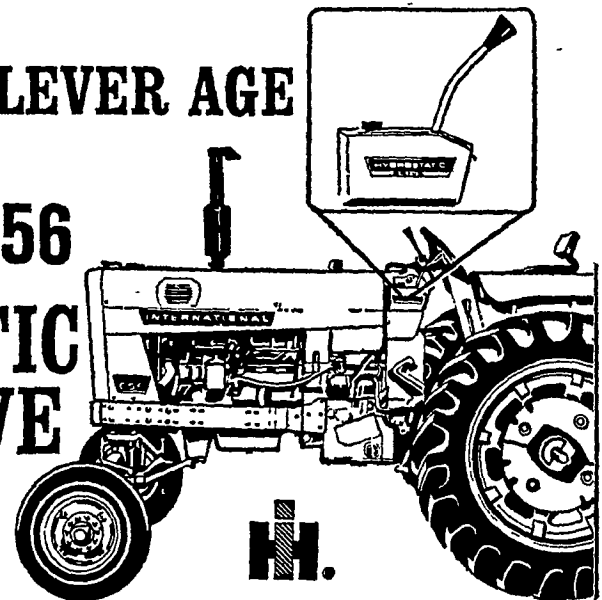
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
