Ruth Ball, a county home economist; Mrs. Nancy Shukaitis, a Monroe County Commissioner; and William White, Philadelphia County Agent.

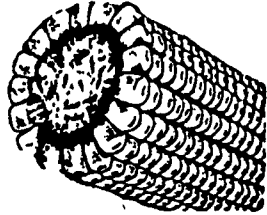
Miss Lempa received her crown from State Secretary of Agriculture Leland H. Bull. She also received a \$100 cash prize, and an expense paid trip to Hershey.

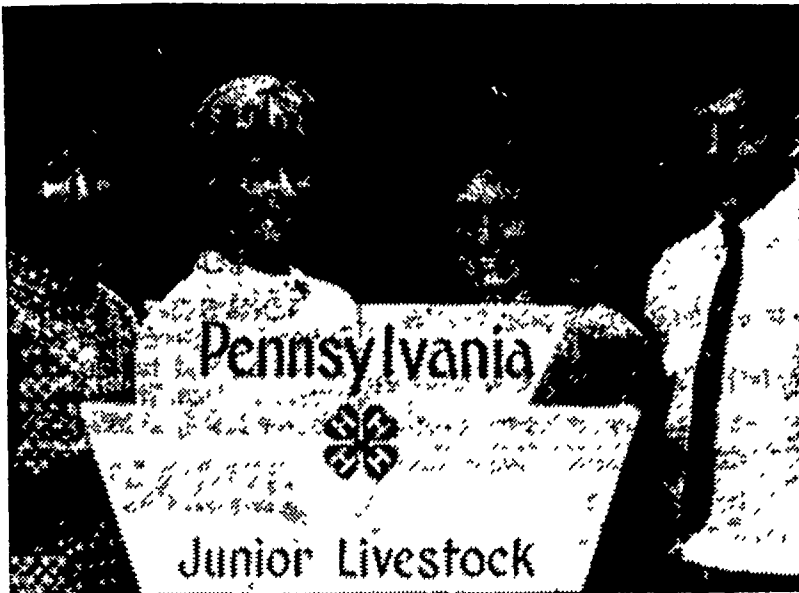
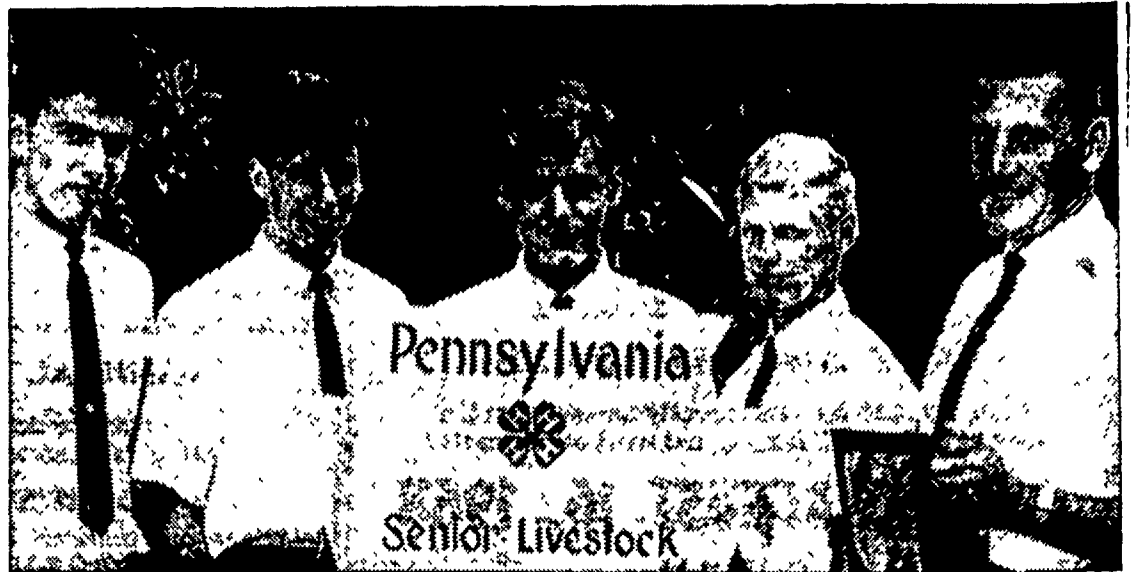

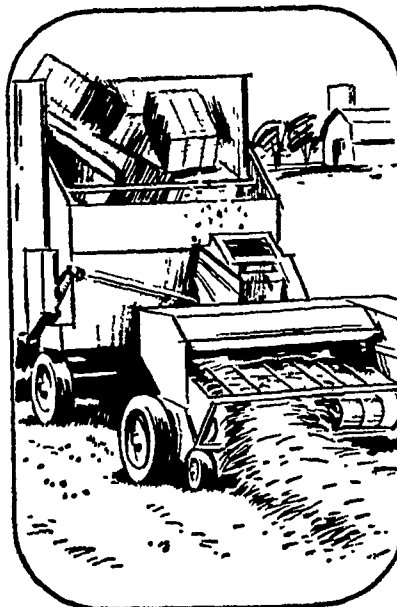
debt so that he could make plans to get married again. Green Thumb has brought much praise from Congress, which continues to consider job programs in the War on Poverty. Several bills are currently being considered by the Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee and the House Labor and Education Committee

Senator Gaylord Nelson (D-Wis.) commented at a Green Thumb workers' training session at Marshfield, Wis. last week that it was the most successful anti-poverty program. Congressman Melvin Laird (R-Wis.) told the same group "I assure you that this is one of the most important programs in the whole poverty program and I will work to see that it gets the highest priority." Similar praise has also come from Senators Harrison Williams (D-N.J.) and Jacob Javits (R-N.Y.), Congressmen William D. Hathaway (D-Me.) and Albert H. Que (R-Minn.), as well as Jack Howard, Executive Assistant to the Secretary of Labor

Other projects sponsored by Farmers Union include Neighborhood Youth Corps, a displaced farm workers' training project, and other senior citizens' projects. All are simply part of the organization's willingness to experiment in the quest for answers to the problems of poverty among the rural families of the Nation. And one thing is clear now: The most direct route out of poverty is a job of useful work.
