

**Fresh Fruit Flavor** The process can help give more of a fresh fruit flavor and aroma to frozen, instant, and canned citrus products. Improved flavor in the instant orange juice resulted from adding orange essence, as well as locked-in orange oil.

Five to ten times as much flavor essence is obtained from citrus peel and processing liquids as from any other methods as a result of a new process researchers in the U. S. Department of Agriculture developed.

report on fats and oils, margarine manufacturers used 128.9 million pounds of all oils in May of this year as compared with 135.8 million in April. True, of the total 92.3 million pounds were soybean oil in May as against 99.7 million pounds in April.

"There were 12.8 million pounds of corn oil (in May) and 13.9 million in April. But, there were 12.2 million pounds of lard and edible tallow consumed in margarine for May and 11.4 million pounds for April. In other words, the amount of corn oil used in processing was not too far apart from the amount of lard and edible tallow used."
