Less Sugar Used At Home

Sugar for home use has decreased from about 60 percent of all sugar deliveries to 27 percent in the past 30 years, according to the U S Department of Agriculture. The Department found institutional and industrial usage has increased correspondingly. Direct cause of this shift is a result of the home-maker buying an increasing portion of sugar in convenience foods. Presugared items and "ready-to-eat" products lower the needs of sugar in the home.
