## Chicago Cattle Weekly Review

Compared with last Friday, slaughter steers steady to 50 lower. Slaughter heifers mostly 50 lowed. Cows and bulls unchanged.

Local receipts 17,000 compared with 16,500 last week and 20,000 last year.

Overall finish of slaughter steers was about the same as last week with 11 percent Prime and 74 percent Choice. This compares with 14 percent Prime and 72 percent Choice last year. Local receipts consisted of 72 percent Slaughter Steers, 23 percent Heifers and the balance mainly cows. Average cost and weight of Slaughter Steers were estimated at 28.50, highest since April, 1966, and 1147 lbs. lightest since last December. This compares with 28.02 and 1151 lbs last week, and 27.59 and 1155 lbs last year. Heifer supply mostly Average Good to Low Prime weighing 800-900 lbs.
