**CATTLE** — Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers steady to 50 higher, with most upturn on High Choice and Prime over 1200 lbs. slaughter heifers and cows steady to 25 lower. Bulls 50 lower.

Local receipts 18,300 compared with 14,900 last week and 20,800 last year. Supply consisted of 70 percent slaughter steers, 24 percent heifers and the balance mainly cows. Overall finish of slaughter steers was not much different than a week ago with 15 percent Prime and

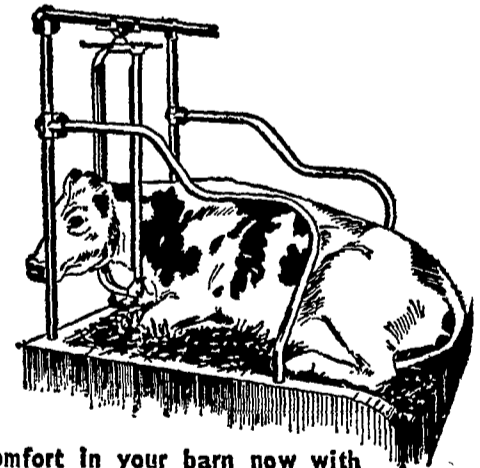
