

Garden Spot YF Schedule Protein Meet

The Garden Spot Young Farmers have scheduled a protein supplement and substitute information meeting for Tuesday, Sept. 24 at 7:30 p.m. in the high school Vo-Ag department, at New Holland.

Speakers will include two professionals and two farmers. Dr. Culton, Nutritionist for Miller and Bushong Inc., will speak on the subject, "Feeding Value of Standard Supplements and the use of Urea Additives to Corn

Silage". Robert Steele, Livestock and Dairy Specialist for Agway, will have the subject, "Liquid Protein Supplement Programs".

Local farmers on the program are Larry Weaver, New Holland R1, a beef farmer, who will describe his use of urea in silage and Raymond Hoover, Gap R1, a dairy farmer, who will describe his use of liquid protein supplements.

A question and answer period will follow, and the meeting will feature a protein supplement identification contest. The meeting is open to any interested farmer.

Farm Center Directors Meet

The board of directors for the Lancaster County Farm and Home Foundation met Tuesday night in the Farm and Home Center. Farm Center business manager Howard Campbell, reported estimated total rentals from meeting rooms for the year will be \$3,327. There are 49 meetings set for September. At the conclusion of Campbell's report, Amos Funk suggested a vote of commendation for the business manager on his fine record keeping and the board rose for the confidence vote.

Board President Snavely Garber named Funk, Dr. E. I. Robertson, Melvin Stoltzfus, Forney Longenecker and Everett Kreider to a committee to study Foundation-sponsored educational meetings at the Center. M. M. Smith was named as an advisor to the committee.

The board was also informed that Sen Joseph S. Clark will make a short visit to the Center next week enroute to speak at Millersville State College. A representative group of farmers and Farm and Home Foundation directors will be on hand to tour the building with the senator. It was stressed that the meeting will not be political.

Regulated Shooting Grounds Season Opened September 16

The hunting season for regulated shooting grounds in Pennsylvania began one-half hour before sunrise last Monday, September 16.

Hunting on regulated shooting grounds may continue until sunset on March 31, 1969.

Regulated shooting grounds are operated under permits issued by the Game Commission, and are either private or commercial in nature.

Pheasants, quail and chukar partridges propagated (or purchased) and released on the regulated shooting grounds may be taken during the September 16-March 31 period without regard to daily or possession limits or sex or age.

ulated shooting grounds may be taken during the September 16-March 31 season without regard to sex or age, or daily or season bag limits so long as the operator of the facility, during the shooting season, does not exceed specified percentages of birds released on the grounds.

Captive-reared mallard ducks (with the hind toe removed from the right foot) released on the grounds may also be taken during the September 16-March 31 period without regard to daily or possession limits or sex or age.
