**Corn-Tobacco Crops**

After the recent rains throughout the area, the corn and tobacco crops should mature rapidly and give improved yields. The corn crop looks promising and the cribs should be prepared for refilling, that is, if they have been emptied of the 1967 crop. Before the new corn is stored, it is suggested that the crib be sprayed with either methoxychlor or malathion in order to kill any grain insects. All interior surfaces of the crib should be sprayed. Also, the rodent-proofing of the crib is very important to protect the corn and prevent losses

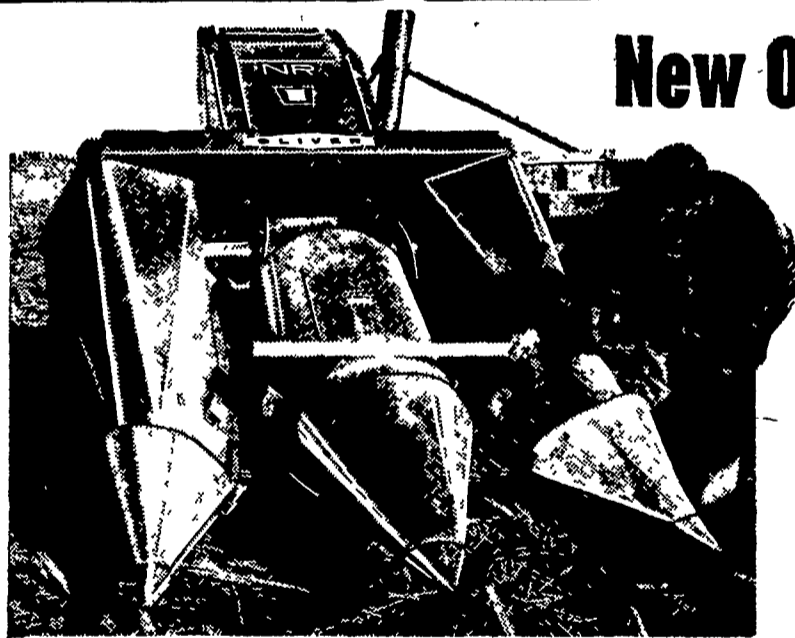

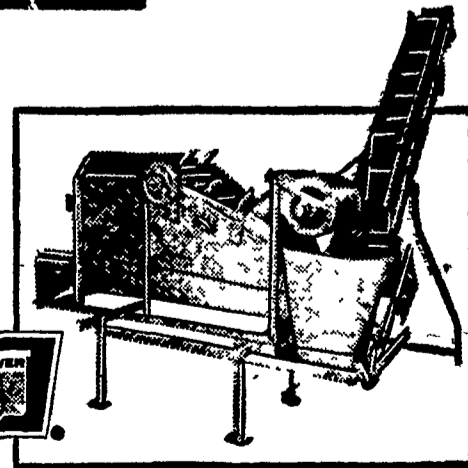
