It was decided to sell candies as a money making project. The slate of new nominees for the expiring terms of present officers will be presented in October.

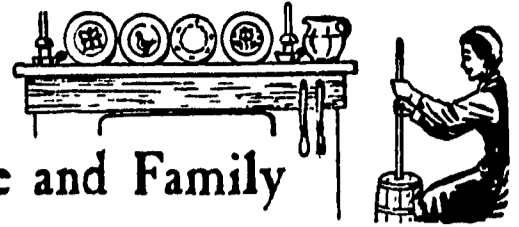

are not dry. Spread over filling making peaks with the back of a spoon, being sure to seal carefully to crust. In a preheated 425 degree oven bake 5-10 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool on wire rack and then in refrigerator. Cut into squares to serve 8 to 10 servings.

Ladies, Have You Heard?...

Fresh Lemons Available Year Round
You can use fresh lemons in a variety of dishes which are appropriate to serve any time of the year.

The best lemons have a rich yellow color. They're firm, juicy, and have a reasonably smooth-textured skin.

Coarse skin texture is a sign of thick skin and less than normal juice.

Avoid lemons with a darker yellow color, soft spots and punctures — they're signs of age or possible decay.

What Is Aged Meat?

Fresh meat usually reaches the retail display within 6 to 10 days after the beef is slaughtered.

Some high quality beef is aged by holding it at temperatures of 34 to 38 degrees for 3 to 6 weeks or by holding it for 2 days at about 70 degrees.

Ultraviolet light reduces bacterial growth if it's held at 70 degrees.

The aging process develops additional tenderness and a characteristic flavor.

Proper aging of meat requires controlled conditions. That's why it is not advisable to try this at home.

Because of special handling and storage and because aged beef must be top-quality beef, you're likely to find the price

per pound higher than beef not aged.

New Sherbet Flavor

Research at the University of Minnesota has paved the way for a new flavor in sherbet by using apples. Scientists spray-dry apple solids into powder, then add it to the sherbet mix.

When You Buy Melons

Look for these melons at your market.

Cranshaw (a green and gold melon that's pear-shaped). Look for one that has a bright, deep golden yellow color. Remaining green areas should show traces of yellow. The flesh is a salmon.

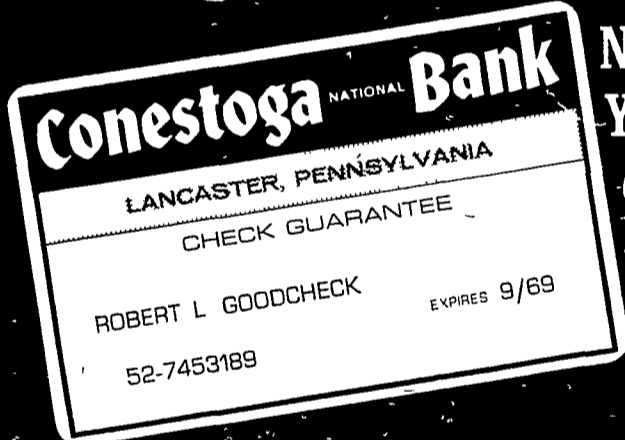
