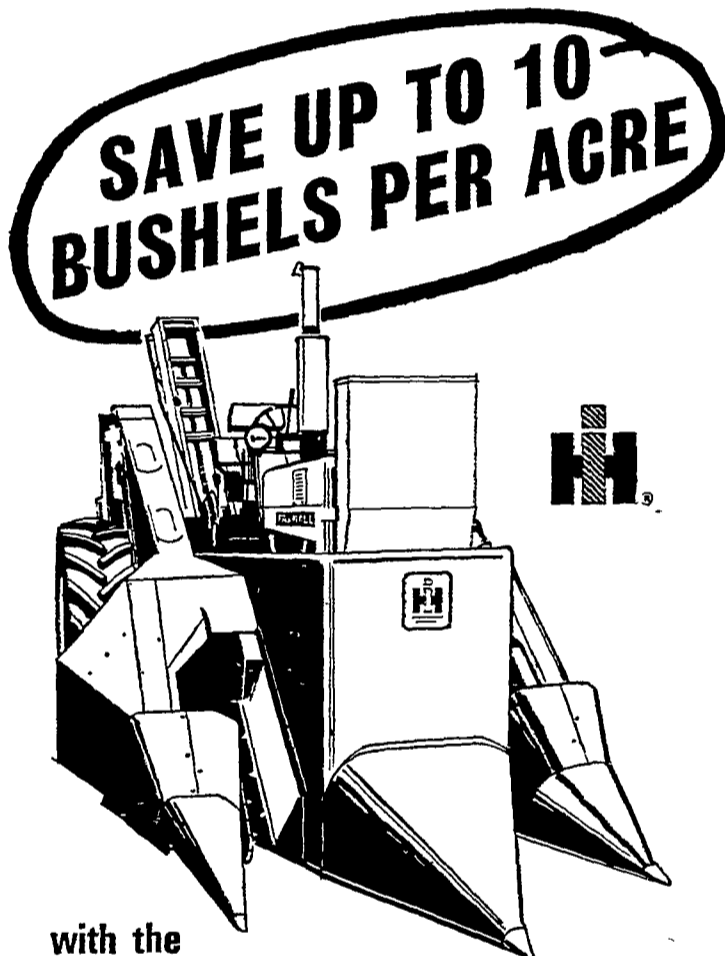

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European Markets Sought For Pennsylvania Products

Increased markets for Pennsylvania agricultural products to be sought this month by the Department of Agriculture during the IKOFA food trade fair in Munich, Germany, Sept. 21-29

Pennsylvania is one of several states participating in the biennial IKOFA show, which attracts leading importers and wholesale and retail buyers from throughout western Europe.

Representatives of the Department of Agriculture will display and demonstrate processed fruits and vegetables, grape juice, processed chicken and turkey, scrapple, apple butter, candy, cigars and pretzels. In addition, the complete array of Pennsylvania agricultural products available for export will be promoted.

Previous participation in trade shows in Cologne, London and Tokyo have generated considerable interest in Pennsylvania food abroad.

Export sales of Pennsylvania agricultural products — both fresh and processed — now amount to over \$40 million annually. Total agricultural exports from the United States amount to about \$6 billion

"Pennsylvania is not yet getting its fair share of this export of agricultural products." Secretary of Agriculture Leland H. Bull said "However, through participation in food trade fairs such as IKOFA and others around the world, we can do much to remedy the situation."
