Junior Dairy Show Entries Set Record

HARRISBURG — Junior competitors held the spotlight in Monday's opening of the fifth Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show at the Farm Show complex here.

The number of junior entries, 596, eclipsed all records of previous shows as 4-H and FFA youngsters competed in the 15th annual Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show.

"You have to be impressed with the quality as well as the quantity," said Leland H. Bull, Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture.

Junior Champion

Locally, Byron Smeltz, 14 of Elizabethtown showing "Mason's Homes Flashy Carla," an intermediate calf, won junior champion honors in the 4-H Avianire Show. The winner was sired by "Oak Ridge Flashy Klondike," and the dam is "Mason's Homes Carleen." A first year 4-H member, Byron is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Smeltz. He also won a master fitter award.

Nelson Wenger, Manheim R2, showed Hen-Ket Model Cows to first place in the FFA Holstein Senior Calf Class. Nelson was also named a master fitter and master showman.

The Hess entry topped the 54 head of Holsteins paraded before Judge Raymond Witmer, Willow Street, and was also awarded the best udder ribbon.

The reserve grand champion was the aged cow owned by Elvin Hess Jr., Strasburg R1 and shown by Ebshalom Karniel, the IFYE exchangee from Israel staying with the Elvin Hess Jr. family. Karniel had never seen a cow show or led a cow before in his 21-year-old experience.

He had previously been the best showman at the FFA County Swine Show held at the Lancaster Union Stock Yards in August. Earl also had the first place light weight and the first place heavy weight entries at the Ephrata show.

Other first place wins were given by judge Henry Gruber, A and B Packing, Allentown to Kenneth Weber on his light weight trio; Linford Weaver on a medium weight trio and Philip Leininger on a heavy weight trio.
