

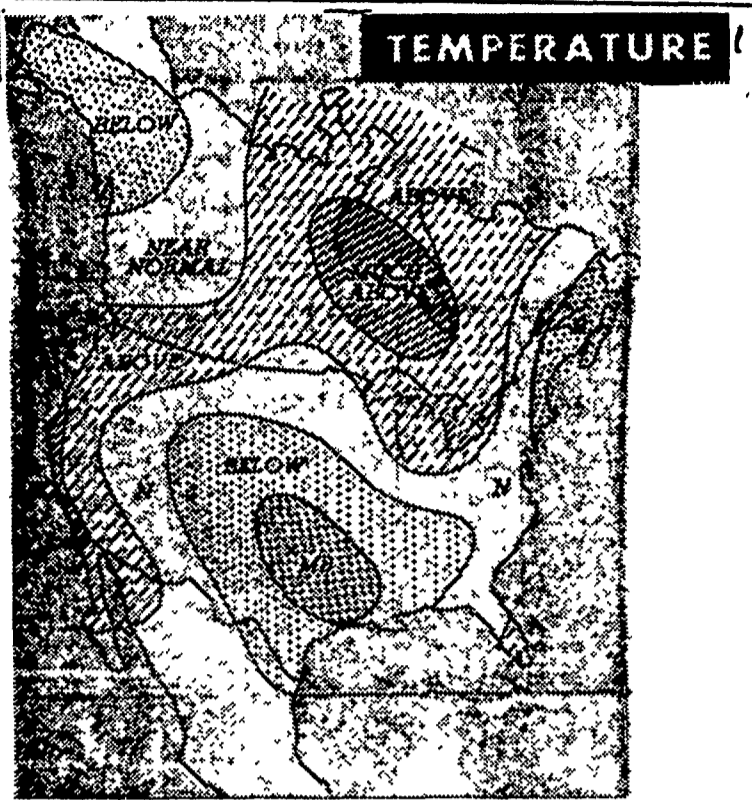
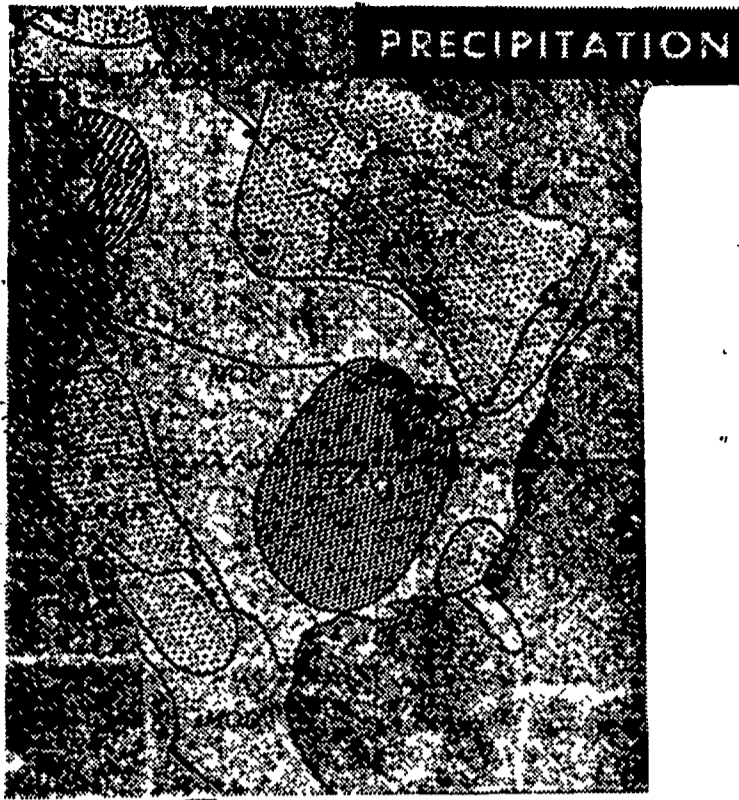
WEATHER OUTLOOK

Weather Bureau Extended Forecast Division.

FOR MID-SEPTEMBER TO MID-OCTOBER 1968

PRECIPITATION is predicted to exceed normal over most of the central portion of the Nation lying between the Rockies and the Appalachians and also along immediate coastal regions from Hatteras to southern New England. Subnormal amounts are indicated over the far Southwest and part of the extreme Southeast. In other areas near normal rainfall is indicated.

TEMPERATURES are expected to average below seasonal normals over most of the area lying between the Appalachians and the Rockies except for near to above normal along the northern border states. Above normal temperatures are expected in the Pacific coast states. Except for below normal temperatures over eastern New England near normal averages are expected to prevail elsewhere.



Archery Deer Season Opens Today, Sept. 28

Pennsylvania's 1968-69 seasons for big game will get underway, when archers begin hunting whitetail deer on Saturday, September 28.

The Keystone State, which has had unusually large deer herds for the past several seasons, has a whitetail population this year even larger than that of 1967.

There will be 24 hunting days during the regular statewide archery deer season. The regular archery season closes on

October 25, one day before the opening of the general small game season. Sunday hunting is prohibited.

An extended 15-day archery deer season is scheduled to begin December 26. Use of bow and arrow is also permitted during the regular antlered and antlerless seasons in December.

Hunting hours for bowmen will be from one-half hour before sunrise until sunset.

Archers are permitted to take one deer of either sex, regardless of size. If a hunter bags a deer during the archery season, he is not permitted to take another whitetail during the regular gunning season.

Conditions are again favor-

able for archers to break existing records for license sales and number of deer taken by bowmen in a single year. During the 1967-68 seasons 110,000 archers took 3,251 whitetails — a record license sale and harvest.

Game Commission field reports indicate that deer are plentiful throughout the state, for hunters to concentrate on and that it would be desirable areas where farmers seek relief from crop damage.

This year's rainfall has produced rather lush vegetation, and dense cover reduces visibility. Bowmen should be extra cautious, and should be sure of their targets.
