Weather Bureau Extended **Forecast Division** 

#### FOR MID-SEPTEMBER TO MID-OCTOBER 1968

**PRECIPITATION** is predicted to exceed normal over most of the central portion of the Nation lying between the Rockies and the Appalachians and also along immediate coastal regions from Hatteras to southern New England. Subnormal amounts are indicated over the far Southwest and part, of the ex-, treme Southeast. In other areas near normal rainfall is indicated.


**TEMPERATURES** are expected to average below seasonal normals over most of the area lying between the Appalachians. and the Rockies except for near to above normal along the nor-. thern border states. Above normal temperatures are expectedin the Pacific coast states. Except for below normal temperatures over eastern New England near normal averages are expected to prevail elsewhere.




