**A Half-Million Tons Of Liming Materials Sold In Pennsylvania**

Almost a half-million tons of liming materials were sold in Pennsylvania during the first six months of 1968, according to the State Department of Agriculture.

Tonnage figures compiled

from affidavits received from manufacturers by the Department's Feed and Fertilizer Division indicate that farmers purchased 468,458 tons of pulverized agricultural limestone; 12,287 tons hydrated lime; 5,754 tons burned lime and 3,650 tons miscellaneous materials (slag, gypsum, marl and oyster shell).

The Pennsylvania Lime Law requires that manufacturers offering liming materials for sale in the Commonwealth for agricultural use must register with the State Department of Agriculture. This assures proper labeling and that the product meets requirements as to weight and contents.
