Clark Applauds Family Farm

Senator Joseph S. Clark (D-Pa.), speaking at the Lancaster County Farm and Home Center Wednesday night, urged preservation of the family farm as "important to our survival in the world community."

Clark told the predominately rural audience of his efforts in the Senate to prevent giant corporations from squeezing out the family farm and of his work for programs to give the small farmer a chance by raising farm income and bringing economic development opportunities to rural Pennsylvania.

"The family farm, with its heritage of working toward a common goal and for the common good, embodies the best spirit of our communities. The values learned in the family structure are important in determining what kind of citizen a youth will become. We have only to look at the youngsters who are in trouble — the neglected, rootless, pathetic youngsters who fill our correctional institutions — to know that somewhere the structure has broken down, that they have lost that spirit of pulling together. That spirit was important for survival in our frontier days, and it is important now for our survival in the world community."

"Freedom of conscience is important, too," Clark stated "for without it society cannot be deemed free at all." Clark reflected on his position in opposition to the war in Vietnam and likened it to the struggle of Lancaster County's Old Order Amish for exemption from social secu-

ity taxes. Senator Clark was exempt from the payment of principal sponsor of the success such taxes members of religious sects

Melvin Bradley Extension Investor's specialist at the University of Missouri — Columbia lists factors that help a boar pay for himself when he sires a thousand pigs which are later marketed

The boar increases feed efficiency 5 pounds per 100 pounds gain, or he increases sale price of market hogs 15 cents per hundredweight or he pays for himself when 30 of his daughters are sold as breeding gilts for market price plus \$10 a head

Bradley says some good tested boars have accomplished all of these and more, in herds in Missouri
