State Agriculture Secretary Leland H. Bull today pledged "the full support and cooperation" of the Department of Agriculture in tracking down the source of a disease that is endangering peach orchards in Pennsylvania.

The condition has killed trees and caused loss of fruit in peach growing areas of Pennsylvania and other states this season, he stated.

"The situation is serious and everything possible must be done to isolate the cause," Secretary Bull said. "The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture will cooperate in every way in seeking a solution to this problem."

He indicated that his department is prepared to assist in research to identify and control a virus suspected of causing the trouble.

Damage, he said, shows up in orchards causing stunting of growth, followed by defoliation and final death of trees.

The situation has developed a mounting concern in recent weeks among growers, state and federal Agriculture Departments, and scientists at The Pennsylvania State University.
