CORN PRICE SUPPORT

All farmers who participated in the 1968 Feed Grain Program are eligible for price support loans on their corn crop.

Loan rate for corn stored on the farm is \$1.26 per bushel. Warehouse storage is available at Cargill Inc., Marietta. Only shelled corn will be accepted for warehouse storage. Loan rate is \$1.16 from Oct. 11th to Nov. 7th and advances about 1 cent per month. This rate is for No. 2 corn, with not more than 15% moisture. Drying and shrinking charges for corn over

15% moisture will be 1½ cents for each ½% over 15%.

AGRICULTURAL CONSERVATION PROGRAM

To date, the allocation for 1969 ACP has not been received. When it is and the County program is approved, accepting of applications for practices will begin. Farmers should take soil tests now, so they have the results when they enroll. Soil tests made by the Pennsylvania State University are required for lime and fertilizer.

1969 WHEAT & FEED GRAIN

Farmers who are interested in enrolling in the 1969 wheat program, are reminded to plant

within the wheat allotment, plan to divert 15% of the allotment and maintain the conserving base

Certificate payment will be based on 43% of the allotment, and payment can be earned for diverting all or part of the allotment not planted. If the allotment is 21.7 acres or less, the entire allotment can be diverted. If over 21.7, the maximum diversion is the larger of 50% of the allotment, or 25 acres minus 15% of the allotment.

Details of the Feed Grain program are not available at this time. Minimum diversion will
