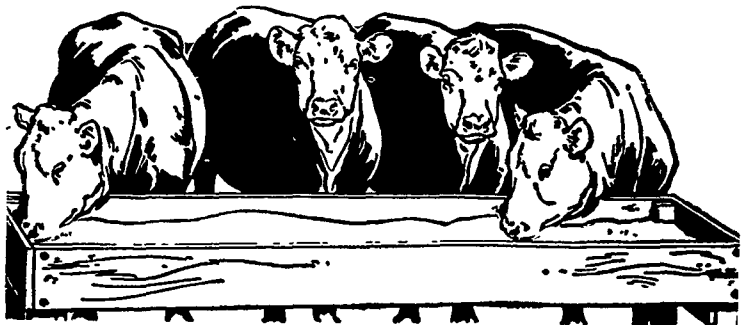
Clair Zerby, agriculture instructor at Warwick High School, attended the convention.

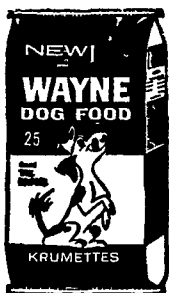

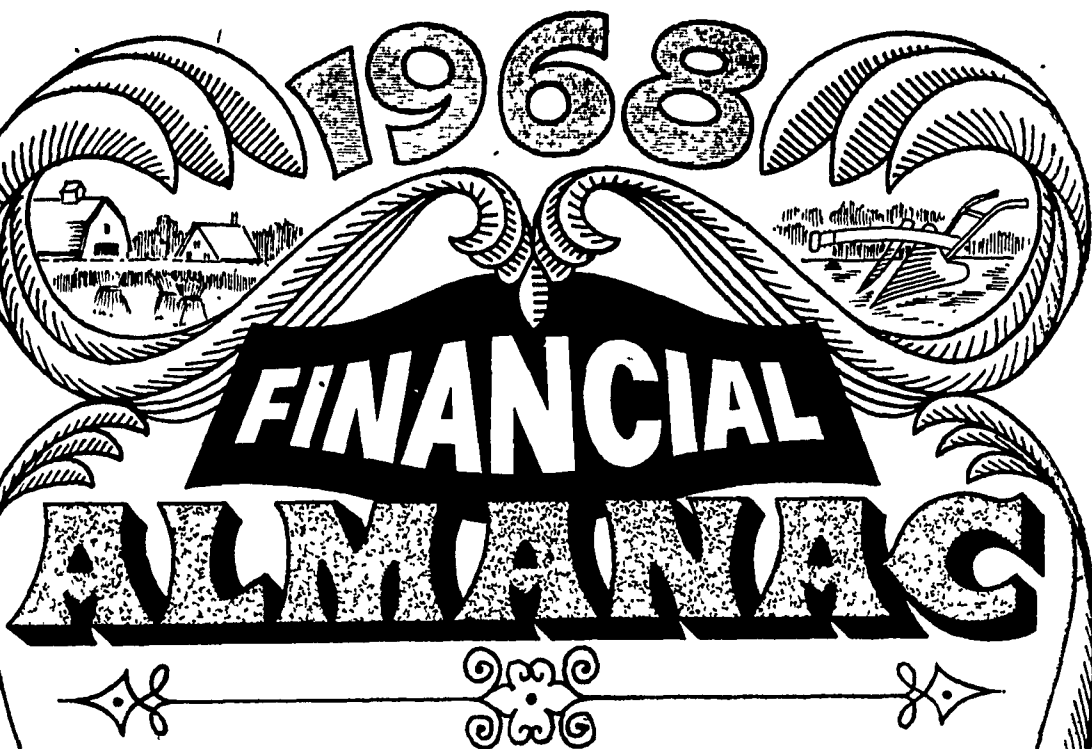
