### Care of Sheep

Sheep growers might want to worm the flock for the last time this season, if it has not been done in the past month or so. As the flock moves from summer to winter quarters, it is advisable to be certain that the internal parasite problem is eliminated. The individual treating of each animal is recommended over the salt or the feeding method in order to be sure that each animal is treated. For best results the ewe flock should be allowed to have outside exercise each day during the winter season.

## Chicago Cattle Weekly Review

**CATTLE** — Compared with the previous Friday, slaughter steers steady to 25 higher, heifers fully steady Cows steady to strong Bulls fully steady Local receipts 20,800, compared with 18,300 last week and 21,400 last year This weeks supply includes about 2,500 for the annual feeder auction. Demand for slaughter steers was good throughout the week, with the supply of weights over 1200 lbs very limited Receipts were 70 percent slaughter steers and 19 percent heifers, the balance cows and feeder cattle Overall finish of slaughter steers was the same as last week at 12 percent Prime and 78 percent Choice compared with 11 percent Prime and 75 percent Choice last year. The average cost and weight for the week estimated at 28.30 and 1135 lbs. compared with 28.26 and 1141 lbs last week and 27.01 and 1144 lbs last year. Heifers were mostly average good to average Prime 825-1050 lbs
