Weather Bureau Extended Forecast Division

FOR MID-OCTOBER TO MID-NOVEMBER 1968

PRECIPITATION is expected to exceed normal over most of the eastern half of the Nation and also over the Pacific Northwest. Sub-normal amounts are indicated for the far Southwest and western portions of the Northern Plains. Elsewhere near normal precipitation is indicated.

TEMPERATURES are expected to average below seasonal normals over the southern portion of the Nation lying between the Appalachians and the southern Plateau Region. Above normal averages are expected along the Atlantic seaboard and in the Great Lakes Region. In unspecified areas near normal temperatures are indicated, although with large intermonthly fluctuations.

PA.'S POTATO CROP

A revised estimate of the state's potato crop indicates a production of 7,980,000 hundred-weight. An October 1 survey by the Penna. Crop Reporting Service reveals the crop will be reduced by 12 percent from a year ago but would be 14 percent above the five-year (1962-66) average.

Yield per acre is expected to reach 210 cwt., second only to the record 1967 yield of 240 cwt. Total acreage for this year's crop is 38,000.

The Service reports harvest of major fall varieties nearly 40 percent completed by October 1 with quality considerably better than in recent years.
