GOVERNMENT COSTS WENT UP

Taxes went up. As Governor of Alabama, George Wallace spent so that budgets went up 50% and bonded state indebtedness reached an all-time high.* Alabama has a 6% sales tax which is also applied to food purchases. When Wallace talks about government economy, remember what happened to Alabama. Government costs and taxes went up!

CRIME INCREASED

While Wallace was Governor, the crime rate increased in Alabama consistently faster than for the nation as a whole. Alabama ranked highest in the U.S. in murder per 100,000 population with 11.4. * (The Penna. rate is 3.5. The U.S. rate is 5.1). When Wallace talks about crime in the streets, remember what happened in Alabama.

GOVERNMENT BECAME MORE CENTRALIZED

With Wallace as Governor, centralized State power was preferred at the expense of local government.* When Wallace talks about keeping government local, remember what he did in Alabama.

EDUCATION SUFFERED

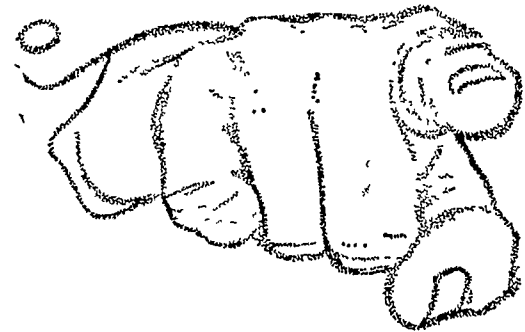
While Wallace was Governor, Alabama had one of the highest illiteracy rates in the nation.* When Wallace talks about education, remember what happened in Alabama.
