research and development work in behalf of farmers of the Northeast.

Fallon pointed out that although Agway does not market milk, a high percentage of its members are dairymen and more than half of its total business is related to the dairy industry.

Since formation of Agway in 1964 by the merger of three regional farmer organizations, the cooperative's board of directors has allocated more than \$57 million for new facilities and equipment and plant modernization programs, according to Fallon.

Membership in the cooperative has risen from 85,000 to 102,000, including 3,000 more in the last year. Members have invested some \$70 million in Agway securities since its founding, Fallon reported.

**Heavy Leaf Fall**
