Leading Livestock Officials To Take Part In Short Course

A number of nation's leaders in practical livestock breeding will head a list of authorities who will participate in a short course on livestock improvement and genetics December 10-11 at The Pennsylvania State University.

The course, of interest to both purebred and commercial livestock breeders in Pennsylvania and neighboring states, will deal with the many different aspects of improving the production level of all species of livestock, said Dwight E. Younkin, Penn State Extension livestock specialist.

Younkin points out that interested livestockmen should write to The Pennsylvania State University Short Course Office, 410 J. Orvis Keller Building, University Park, Pa. 16802 for course details and applications.

Included on the program are Dr. L. V. Cundiff of the University of Nebraska; Dr. C. M. Parker of Ohio State University; and Henry Matthiessen, Jr., and David Brower of Still House Hollow Farms, Hume, Va. All are recognized authorities in livestock management and genetics.

Faculty members from Penn State's Animal Science Department participating in the program are Dr. T. B. King, Dr. T. L. Merritt, Dr. G. S. Sherritt, Dr. L. L. Wilson, and Professor H. R. Purdy.

Several of the topics to be discussed are ways different animal characteristics are inherited; how to accurately measure the performance of different characteristics, such as rate of growth, conformation and carcass desirability; effects of inbreeding, linebreeding, and crossbreeding on the amount of genetic improvement and level of production, and the challenges faced by today's livestock breeder and how they will meet these challenges.

"The variety, thoroughness, and practical application of the discussion topics makes this short course valuable for progressive beef, cattle, horse, sheep, and swine breeders," Younkin emphasized.

Frey Cow Has 1,015 Lbs.

The 2,574th yearly production record exceeding a half ton of butterfat has been completed by a Registered Holstein cow, Fultonway Ivanhoe Pattie (GP), owned by J. Mowery Frey & Son, Fultonway Farms, Lancaster.

The Pennsylvania Holstein's official record of production totaled 27,871 lbs of milk and 1,015 lbs of butterfat in 365 days. She started her lactation at the age of 7 years and 7 months and was milked twice daily.

"Pattie" was bred in the Frey herd. She was sired by Osbornedale Ivanhoe (EX), a bull that has earned a Gold Medal Sire recognition.

Pennsylvania State University supervised the weighing and sample testing of her production in cooperation with the Dairy Herd Improvement Registry program of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

Don't Mulch Tree Seedlings

Too Early — The reason for mulching is to help keep the ground frozen after cold weather sets in. And this helps to keep the little roots cold all winter. So, wait until the ground becomes a bit colder, and leave the mulch around the seedlings until late March or early April.
