Farmer Cooperatives Commend Gov. Shafer

Governor Raymond P. Shafer last week was commended by the Pennsylvania Association of Farmer Cooperatives for initiating a study on the preservation of agricultural land that is now being made by a special committee named by him.

This action was taken at the association's annual meeting at Allenberry, near Boiling Springs. In two other resolutions the association urged the Governor to reappoint Lynn J. Huber to the Milk Marketing Board, of which he is chairman, at the expiration of his term next May 1, and endorsed a motion by the Pennsylvania Rural Electric Association favor-

ing legislation that would "allocate, define and protect" territory to be serviced by the utility.

Huber, the association stated, "is the only member of the Milk Marketing Board who is thoroughly informed on the complexities involved in the production, processing and marketing of milk."

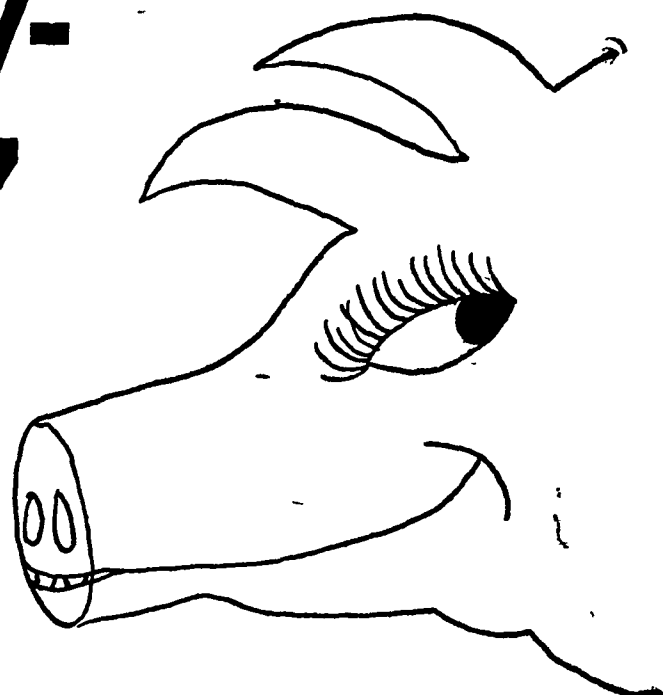

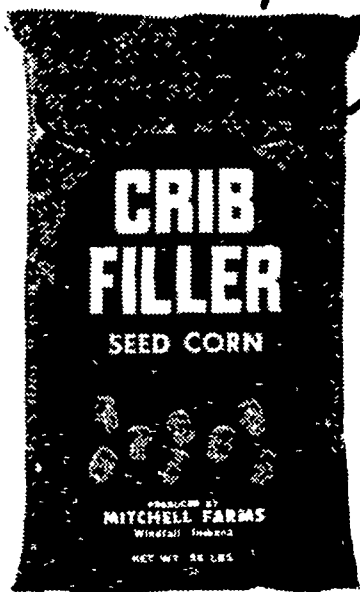
