

READ LABEL BEFORE SPRAYING PESTICIDES

Livestock treated with certain pesticides for control of insects and other pests such as lice, cattle grub and ticks, must be held a certain number of days before being slaughtered, says David O. Quinn, extension specialist at West Virginia University.

The label on the pesticide will contain the information necessary for determining the waiting period from application to slaughter. Directions must be followed exactly to avoid illegal residue that contaminates meat.

Proper use of pesticides will protect livestock, eliminate harmful residue and increase your production of high-quality animals that sell at a good price, Quinn says.

HOME DECORATING AID

Making your home more comfortable is part of your job as homemaker. Individuality develops in decorating when your home is the natural outgrowth of your family's interests.

There are no set rules for home decorating. But, you will need guidelines if you want the satisfaction of creating the changes yourself. You'll find practical guides in a home study course on home furnishing. Available from The Pennsylvania State University, the course is designed to aid the person untrained in decorating.

Course material covers color and the art of combining colors into pleasing color schemes. One section discusses the arrangement of furniture and accessories into attractive and functional groups. Another part of the course has information on buying furnishings such as floor coverings, lamps, curtains, and draperies.

vanilla. Frost sides and tops of stacks, heaping the cream on the top to make a cone-shaped mound. Toast coconut in a skillet. Cool and sprinkle coconut over whipped cream. Chill until ready to serve. Serve with hot spiced cranberry-apple drink.

CRANBERRY APRICOT HAM GLAZE

- 1 can (1 pound) jellied cranberry sauce
 - 1/2 cup brown sugar
 - 1/2 cup drained canned apricots, sieved or 1 can strained apricot baby food
- Beat cranberry sauce with beater until "saucy" smooth. Add brown sugar and sieved apricots. Spoon over ham the last half hour of baking or heat and pour over ham slice just before serving.

CRANBERRY PUDDIN' CAKE

- Topping:**
- 1 1/2 cups fresh cranberries
 - 1 1/2 cups water
 - 1 1/2 cups sugar
 - 2 teaspoons cornstarch
 - 1 tablespoon butter
- Sprinkle of nutmeg
- Cook cranberries in water till they "pop." Mix sugar and cornstarch and add slowly. Cook five minutes. Remove from fire, add butter and nutmeg. Turn into 8 x 8-inch baking pan.
- Cake:**
- 1 1/4 cups sifted flour
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/4 cup shortening
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 1/2 cup cut up dates
 - 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
 - 1/2 cup raisins

Sift flour, baking powder and sugar together. Cut in shortening until consistency of corn meal. Pour in milk and mix well. Blend in dates, walnuts

Consider Launderability Of Clothes

When buying new clothes, check their launderability and choose garments that require minimum care.

Certain construction features, minimum-care fabrics, and special finishes make washing and ironing easier, and save time and energy.

Read hangtags and garment labels to learn the fabric content and amount of shrinkage to expect, as well as some washing instructions. Save the tags.

Check these tags when you launder these garments to give them the best of care.

If washing results differ from those expected from the information given on the tag, return the merchandise to the store. You'll be helping promote reliability in labels and instructions.

Deep, well-finished seams with edges that don't fray easily indicate easy care. And the fewer the seams, the better.

Be sure all parts of the garment are colorfast to machine washing.

Look for well-finished buttonholes, hems, trim, and washable linings.

Closely woven twill or plain weaves are less susceptible to snags and distortions in laundering than loose knits and dmask weaves.

Tips On Using Baking Powder
Although baking powder is a very small part of a recipe it's

Baking powder largely determines the grain, texture, shape, volume, and lightness of baked foods

For good results, the amount of baking powder needed is small and exact

Not quite enough or a bit too much can cause baking failures.

Not all baking powders are alike — the three types of baking powder all contain soda and one or more acid-reacting substances. But acid ingredients differ.

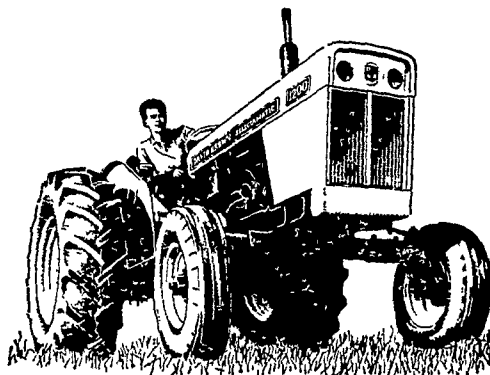

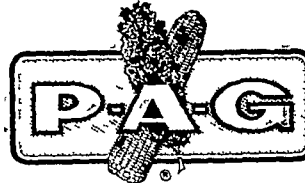
