JOHN DEERE 1520 TRACTOR DEVELOPED

A new tractor which develops 46 PTO horsepower (maximum horsepower at PTO at 2500 rpm, factory observed) has been introduced by John Deere, according to local John Deere dealers. This tractor has been designated the 1520

The 46-horsepower 1520 is right between the 38-horsepower 1020 and the 54-horsepower 2020, which are already in the John Deere line

The 1520 is versatile enough to be the primary tractor on small- and medium-sized farms or a utility tractor on large farms

The John Deere 1520 Tractor is actually a big tractor put into a 46 horsepower package. It is available with either a gasoline or Diesel variable-speed engine. It has a constant-mesh, collar-shift transmission with eight forward speeds and four reverse. An optional Hi-Lo shift increases pull-power 33 percent in any gear and at the same time reduces travel speed 26 percent. Another transmission option is the direction reverser which is also available on 1020 and 2020 Tractors. The direction reverser permits the operator to go from a forward to a reverse gear, or vice versa, without shifting. This feature saves considerable time, particularly on manual loading chores.
