vention in Peoria, Ill., served as 14th master of the Pennsylvania State Grange from 1962 to October 24, 1968.

He has been secretary of the National Grange since 1965 and prior to that was national gatekeeper. Active in the Grange for 34 years, he is a member and past master of Union and Pomona Granges in Butler county.

Three times he was elected to two-year terms as state master, the maximum under Grange rules. As head of the State Grange he gave leadership to a 60,000-member organization of 638 subordinate bodies in 65 counties and 58 Pomona Granges.

As national master of the Grange, he succeeds Herschel D. Newsom who leaves the post after 18 years to take a place on the U.S. Tariff Commission to which he was named by President Johnson.

A former Butler county dairy farmer, Scott's interests have been closely linked with education and agriculture, and as head of the State Grange he gave conscientious statewide leadership in these fields.

He has served on important state commissions by appointments of Governor Shafer and Governor Scranton. He is a member of the Governor's Committee on Preservation of Agricultural Land, the Governor's Committee to determine priorities in state needs, and the State Advisory Committee on Agricultural Research.

He is a member of the advisory council of the State Board of Education, the State Advisory Committee for Vocational

and Technical Schools, and the education and finance committees of the State Chamber of Commerce. He is a past president of the Butler County and Slippery Rock area School boards. He is a director of the Farmers and Traders Life Insurance and National Grange Mutual Insurance Companies, both Grange affiliates.

Twice he has been honored for distinguished service. The New Holland Machine Company conferred on him its Award of Merit in 1966 for outstanding leadership in agriculture. In 1960 the Butler County Pomona Grange cited him as "Man of the Year" for civic leadership and community service.

He is the son of Frank W.

Scott, Butler, R.D. 5, and the education and finance committees of the State Chamber of Commerce. He is married to the former Dorothy McCandless, daughter of Mrs. B. H. McCandless, Butler, R.D. 1, and the late Mr. McCandless. They have three sons, James, an instructor at Princeton University; Thomas, student at Dickinson College, and David, at home. They are members of West Shore Baptist Church, Camp Hill, of which Mr. Scott is a former trustee.

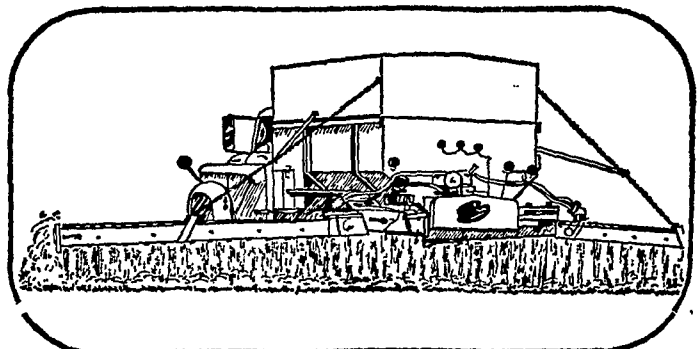
