eight team competition. The contest was held in conjunction with the Eastern National Livestock Show at Timonium.

Richard Buckwalter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard E. Buckwalter, Lititz R3, was the top individual scorer in the contest featuring 11 classes of livestock and three sets of oral reasons. He had 644 points out of a possible 700.

Other team members were Larry Herr, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl B. Herr, 840 Penn Grant Road, Lancaster; Larry High, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey High, Bareville; and Michael Smucker, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward F. Smucker, Ephrata R2. Smucker was 3rd individual with 635 points and Herr was 5th with 621 points.

This same team placed 2nd at the recent Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition in Harrisburg and will be going to Chicago next week to meet national competition.

Virginia was second at the Maryland Exposition followed by West Virginia, North Carolina and Maryland. More than 1,500 entries from 17 states competed in the Eastern National for a total of \$52,000 in prize money.
