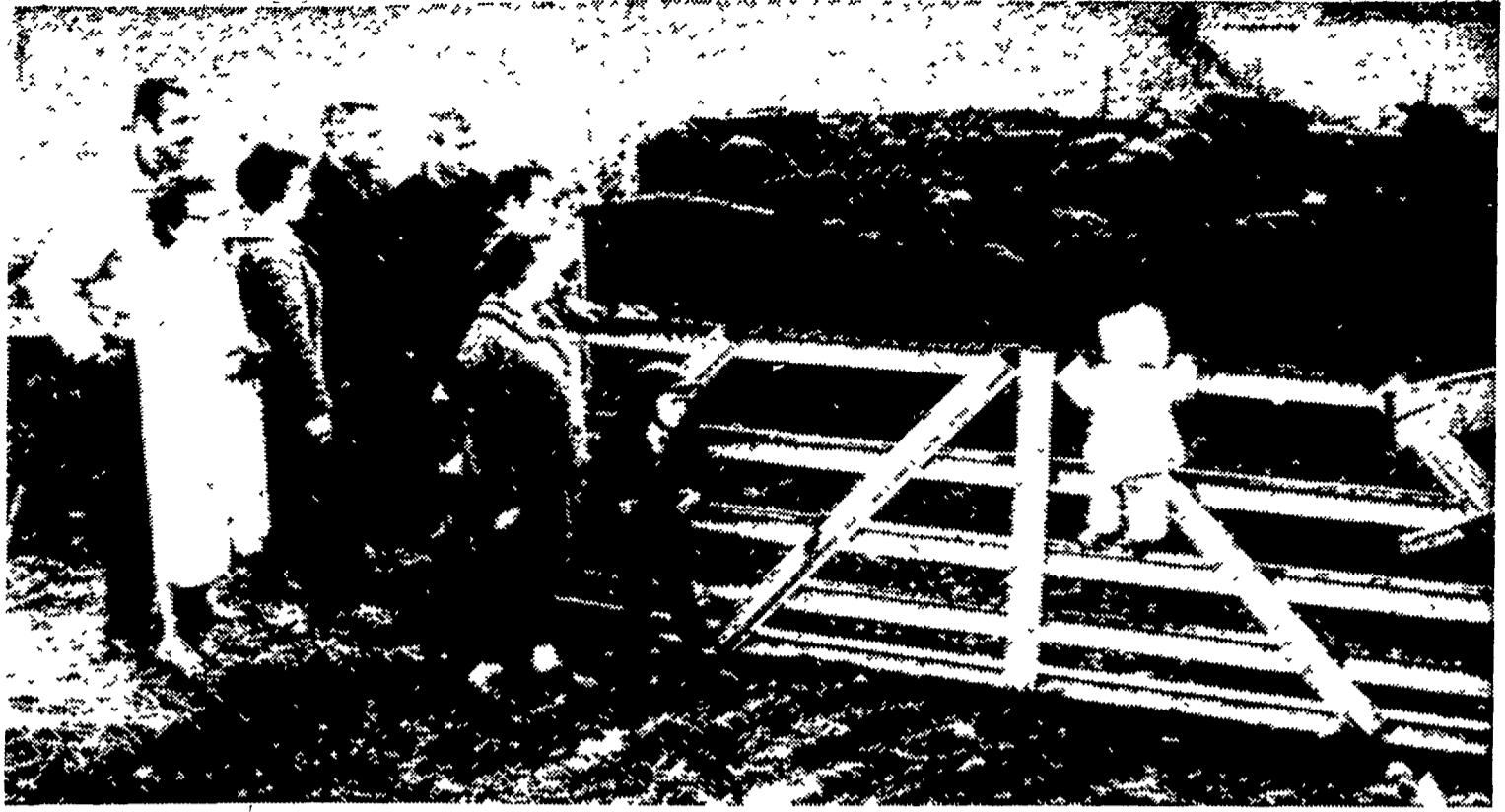


## Community Observes F-C Week

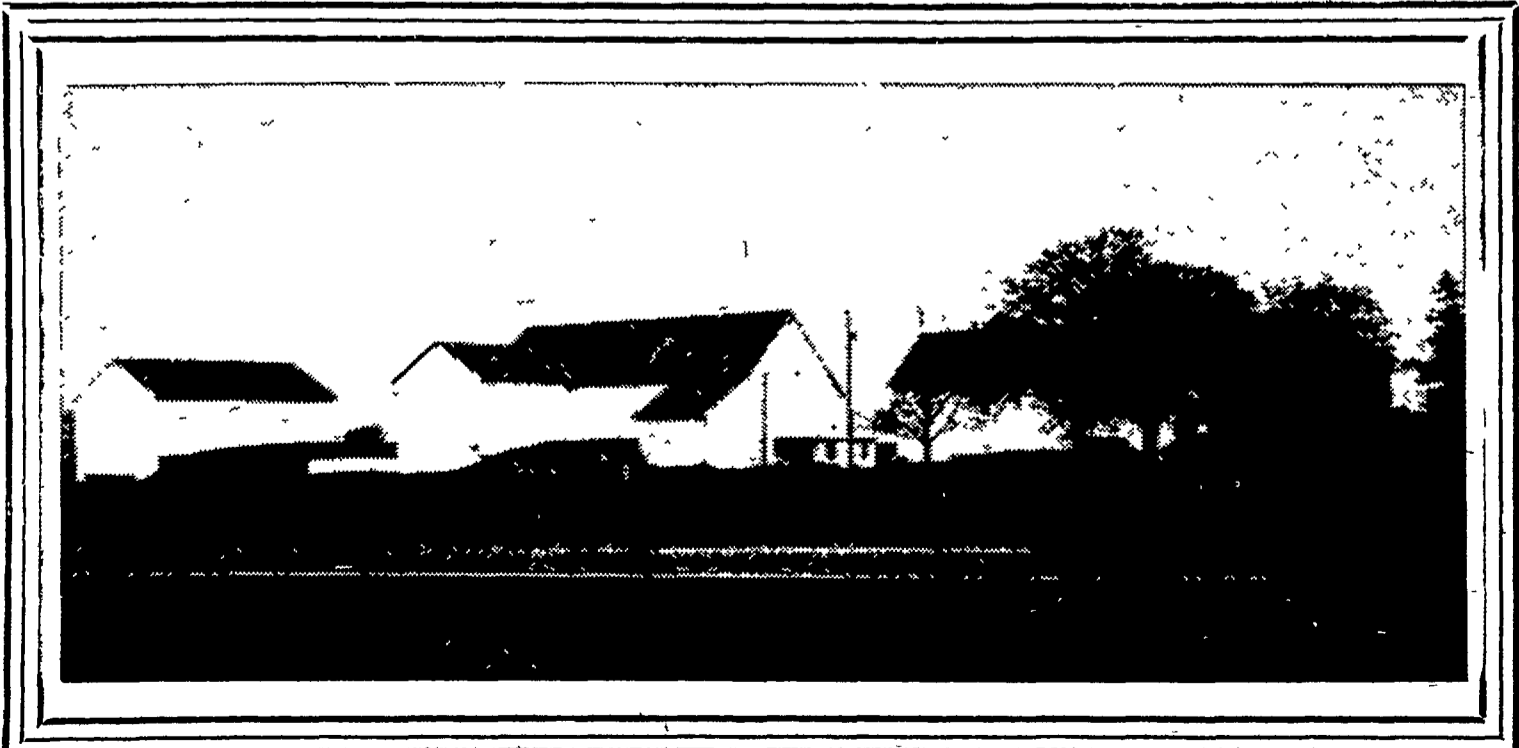
Henry Givler, Area Vo-Ag Supervisor also reported an Honorary Keystone Degree and a Citation Award.
