### The Ag Banquet

The featured speaker of the Ag-Industry Banquet held in the new auditorium of the Farm and Home Center was Calvin D. Johnson, Special Consultant for

Public Affairs for New Holland Division of Sperry Rand Corp. Speaking on the subject "Opportunities Unlimited" Johnson said, "America is the land of opportunity. The only thing that people should ask of government is protection, because it cannot help a man unless he helps himself."

Emphasizing that people should give a day's work for a day's pay, Johnson said he sponsored the "Johnson Work or Don't Eat" law while in the Illinois legislature which forced every able-bodied man on relief to work and earn the amount of his budget. "We ought to go back to the law of no work, no eat," he said.

Quoting the adage, "God helps those who help themselves" Johnson said "the greatest enemy of our nation is laziness. We have an over-production of weakness and a shortage of guts."

Fred C. Edwards, Armstrong Cork Company and President of the Chamber gave the wel-

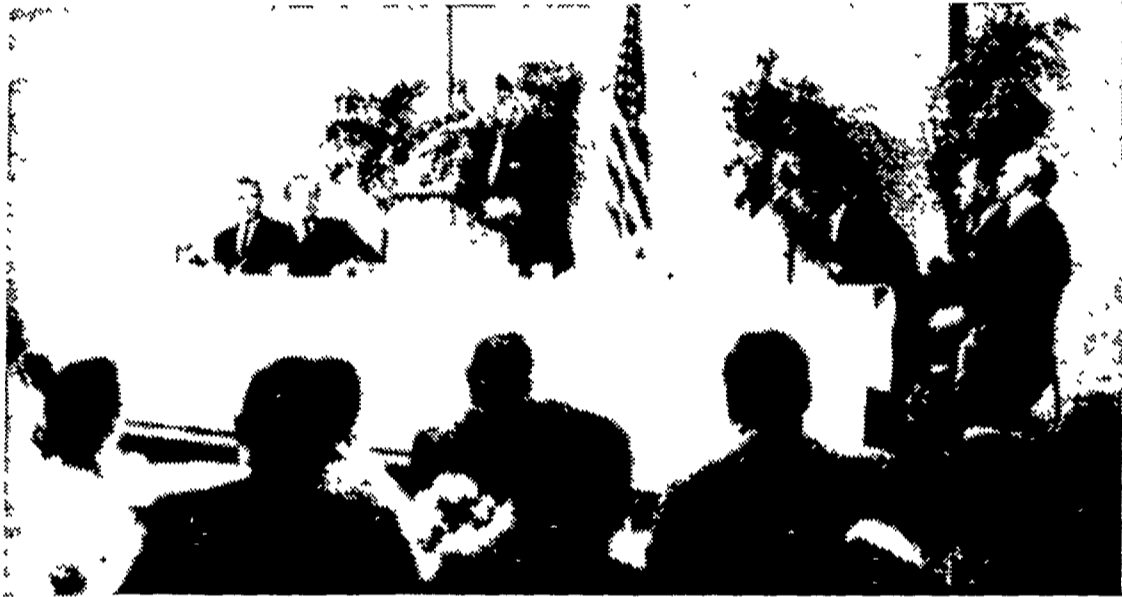


RAYMOND BOLLINGER shows his sixth grade city visitors how to shear a lamb. The event was part of the Ephrata

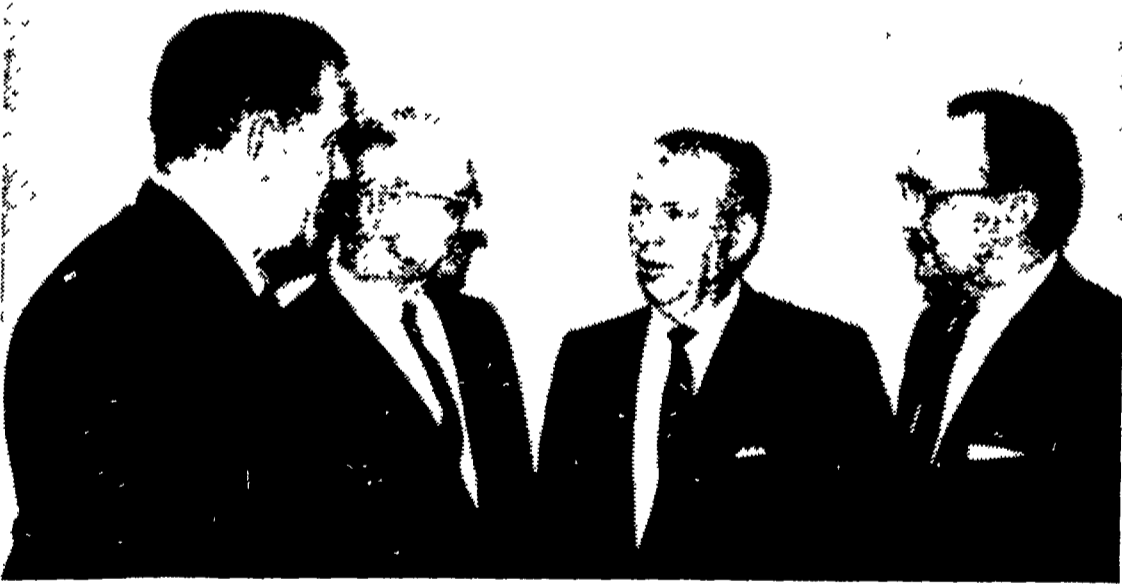
come from the business community and Amos H. Funk, Master Farmer from Millersville R1, gave the greetings from the farm community.

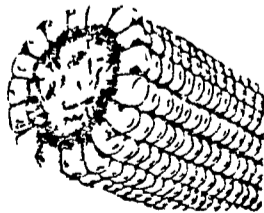
vice president, and Melvin Breneman, Strasburg R1, Secretary-Treasurer.
