Livestock produceis are urged to use supplemental heat such as heat lamps at the time of failowing pigs or ewes that are limbing If the building is already being heated this may not be necessary, however, in unheated barns these young animals may get chilled the first few hours when born during the cold winter months Heat lamps placed over part of the pen will eliminate the dampness and increase the room temperatures for the young Special effort to save lambs and pigs soon after are stronger buth will increase net returns






