### Soviet Agriculture: How's The Current 5-Year Plan Doing?

Crop failure in 1963 and livestock declines in 1964 combined to dim agricultural prospects in the USSR and to bring about a new 5-year plan. Now in its third year, the plan's fertilizer, machinery and over-all economic inputs have lagged behind schedule. But, all these inputs are well above those of previous years — and agricultural output has made an amazing comeback.

An article in the current issue of USDA's Foreign Agriculture magazine points out that weather has been the main factor in this comeback. But, fertilizer deliveries, at 33.7 million metric tons in 1967 were still double the 1963 total, tractor deliveries at 287,400 were 20 pct above the 1963 level, combine deliveries at 96,000 up 20 pct, truck deliveries at 108,100 up 50 pct and capital investment up \$14.5 billion 60 pct. And, 1968 grain output is estimated at 140 million metric tons, up 55 pct. from the 1963 level, with wheat output alone up 88 pct.

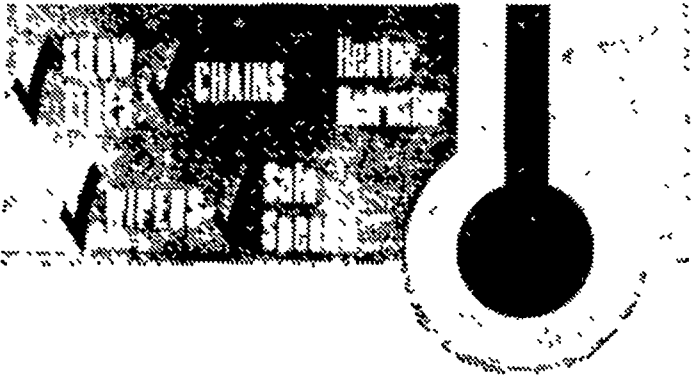

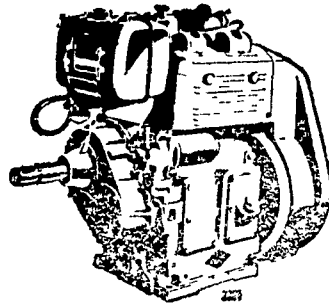
