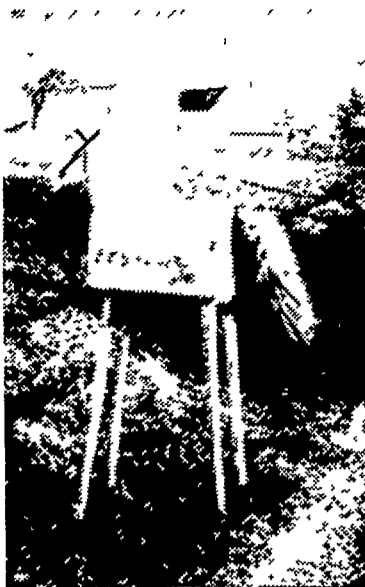

USDA Employee Shows Heroism

Nathaniel F Fine, a member of the U S Department of Agriculture's Vietnam Agricultural Advisory Corps, was honored at a Department of State ceremony here today for an act of heroism beyond the call of duty

The Heroism Award, one of 14 presented, was for Fine's actions as a member of a volunteer party to rescue a Free World Medical Team (Chinese) on Feb 18, 1968, from an area of Phan Thiet city which was under enemy attack

The honor award certificate cites him, "For actions during a dangerous rescue of a free world medical team Although wounded by a grenade he continued to cover the medical team, moving to a more exposed position to assist and protect a severely wounded member of the rescue party for four hours while under fire and completely surrounded by the enemy His courageous acts were instrumental in the success of the rescue"

The certificate will be presented to Fine in Vietnam The entire rescue team already has received individual plaques from the Chinese Military Command-Vietnam in recognition of its efforts.

The other members of the rescue party were Gerald J. Marcotte and James R Smith of the Agency for International Development (AID) mission in Vietnam

Fine is one of 33 members of USDA's Federal Extension Service under a contract with AID who are helping Vietnamese farmers raise their crop production and incomes. Twenty more members of several other USDA agencies are advising the Government of South Vietnam in the development of farm credit, cooperatives, crop research forestry, agricultural economics and statistics programs

Fine arrived at his duty post in Binh Thuan Province on July 8, 1967 He is presently assigned to Binh Dinh Province. Before volunteering for Vietnam agricultural service, he was a Cooperative Extension county agent in Colorado Springs, Colo. Married and the father of two daughters, Fine will return to

The USDA/AID program to help Vietnam farmers was conceived in early 1966 following a visit to South Vietnam by Secretary of Agriculture Orville L Freeman The agricultural advisors help South Vietnamese farmers increase food production in secured provinces of that country. They help farmers obtain supplies and services, provide liaison with local Vietnamese programs, train and advise provincial personnel, and serve as a source of technical agricultural information

The first USDA advisors arrived at their duty posts in February of 1967. Some of their major accomplishments include the introduction of IR-8 rice which has increased yields by three to four times over traditional varieties, significant improvements in irrigation techniques and equipment, and major increases in fish production Both rice and fish are staples in the diets of the Vietnamese people

During 1968, more than 400 specialists of 15 USDA agencies worked on agricultural improvement programs in nearly 40 developing nations in Latin America, Africa, and Asia under joint USDA/AID programs

Despite the downward trend in cropland and farmers, Pennsylvania's agriculture is expected to top the \$900 million mark in cash income this year — for the third year in a row

This cash income is an excellent yardstick, measuring the acceptance of the state's agricultural produce by consumers The demand at the marketplace is for quality products, and Pennsylvania farmers are delivering

Premiums awarded at Farm Show are not a measure of monetary gain, but are symbolic of quality and efficiency — the factors stressed in the 1969 Farm Show theme and a familiar subject to Pennsylvania's farmers

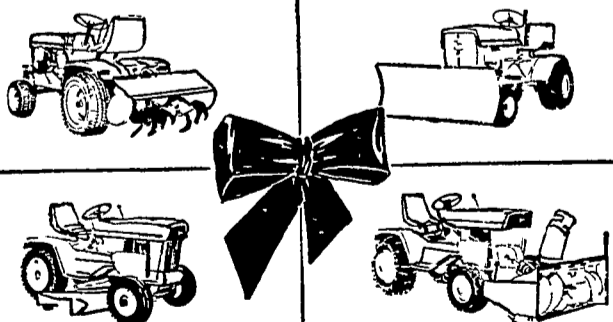
