same as for the State Farm Show and are as follows

Class 76—Wrapper B's Div A—Long wrappers, Over 26 inches Div B—Short wrappers, 26 inches and under Class 77—Filler B's Div A—Long fillers, Over 26 inches Div B—Short fillers, 26 inches and under Class 78—Binder Type Div A Long binders Over 26 inches Div B—Short binders, 26 inches and under Class 81—FFA Wrappers C1—No length specified Class 82—FFA Filler C2—No length specified

A hand of tobacco shall consist of 15 leaves, tied with an other tobacco leaf, select leaves that are uniform in size, color, texture and free from insect disease or mechanical damage. The Filler B types of tobacco are usually heavier in texture while the Wrapper B is a medium weight leaf, chestnut brown color with good stretch. The Binders should have a very thin, silky leaf, light chestnut color with plenty of life and stretch. All exhibits entered in the County Show will be taken to the State Show unless the exhibitor states otherwise. Growers not able to bring their tobacco to the County Show and desiring to exhibit at the State Show, may bring their exhibit to the Farm and Home Center by Friday, January 10th and the Extension Agents will see that it gets to the Farm Show Building. Be sure the tobacco is well wrapped to prevent drying out. Judges for the County Show will be Kenneth Mann and Dick Charles, Jr. Appropriate ribbons and prize money will be awarded.

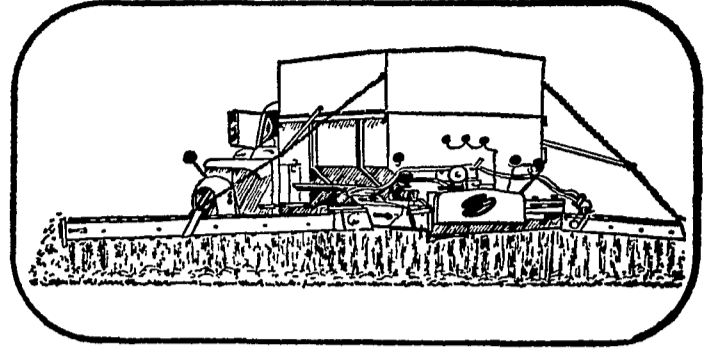
