Poultry Promotional Events Staged At Harrisburg Show

HARRISBURG — The Pennsylvania Poultry Federation, held its annual banquet at the Penn Harris Hotel on Wednesday, during the Farm Show. Featured speaker was Dr. Thomas Haggai, internationally known speaker from High Point, North Carolina, whose topic was "Can We Be Brought Together?" Also appearing on the banquet program were Walter E. Wheelock, Pennsylvania Poultry Federation President; Leland H. Bull, Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture, and Gale Romesberg, Pennsylvania Poultry Queen.

According to Co-Chairmen

Hendrik Wentink, Donald E. Horn and George Hauer, the banquet, which was a fund raising venture for the Poultry Federation, was a sell-out crowd.

During an afternoon meeting sponsored by the Federation Dr. Roland Leach, Pennsylvania State University Nutritionist, discussed "Advances In Poultry Nutrition". The meeting was held in the Dept. of Agriculture Building. A panel discussion was also held featuring the subject "I Grow Pullets This Way Because . . .". The four panel members were Warren Burr, Russell Latshaw, Vernon Norris and James Schubert. The panel was moderated by Dr. Floyd Hicks, Poultry Extension Specialist, Penna State University.

During the five day show Pennsylvania Poultrymen operated their Food Booth on the main floor of the Farm Show Building. Foods served include pickled eggs, egg nog, turkey and chicken sandwiches, chicken corn soup. An all White meat boiler sandwich was added to the menu this year as the featured new item.

On the Governor's Preview Day Sunday at the show, Pennsylvania Poultry Queen, Gale Romesberg, presented a 35 lb turkey as a product representing her industry, to Governor Shafer. She with 11 other agricultural commodity queens toured the show, attended the Pennsylvania State Police Rodeo in the Arena, and were ambassadors for their groups. All of these queens were presented with scrolls by Governor Shafer making them members of the 100,000 Pennsylvanians.

With the cooperation of the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation, Pennsylvania State University, and the Bureau of Markets, Penna Dept. of Agriculture, the Poultry exhibit was revised to include not only the live bird displays, but the complete story of the egg from its incubation, through the growing and laying process of the young chicken, to the grading and packaging of the egg. New Poultry products were featured in tastefully decorated refrigerated cases, and home economists were on hand daily in a display kitchen cooking recipes using poultry and eggs to advantage. The Penna. Game Breeders Association also had displays indicating the growing of game birds as a fine hobby venture.

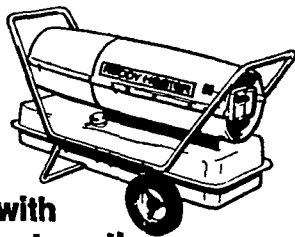
