One distributor labeled the snowmobile the "farmer's toy" because the machine is used in winter when a farmer can enjoy it from afternoon milking until slumber time.

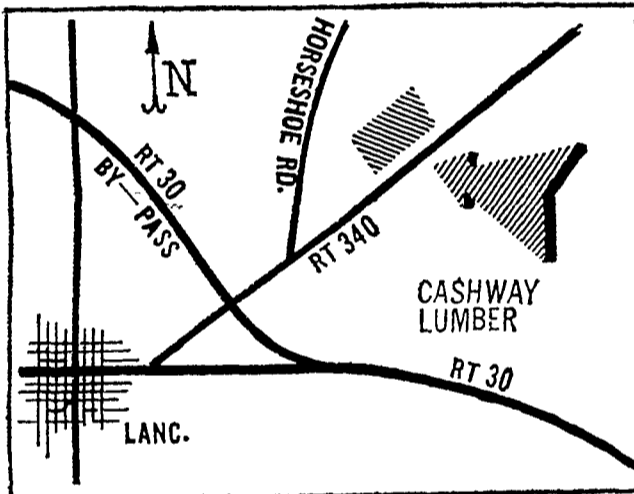
"The snowmobile doesn't interfere with plowing, planting, cultivating or harvesting," the distributor said.

#### Protect Trees

If we get snow cover for any length of time this winter, I hope that owners of small fruit trees and ornamental shrubs will have the plants protected from rabbits and field mice; these rodents like to gnaw on the bark of the tree and can do considerable damage. There are several ways the trees can be protected against rodent injury. One way is to use aluminum foil or fine wire mesh and wrap around the trunk of the tree from the ground up at least 24 inches, also tree wrapping paper may be used to the same height. This distance is needed in case of deep snow for any length of time.
