And later, when the over-all champion was selected, it was the heavyweight Hereford that was tapped the grand champion of the Farm Show.

Bollinger was named the reserve champion in the Hereford breed and in the Angus breed. Michael Longenecker, Litz R2, topped the medium weight class and went on to the reserve championship in that breed. But Robert Peffer from Cumberland County had the best Angus that was also named over-all reserve

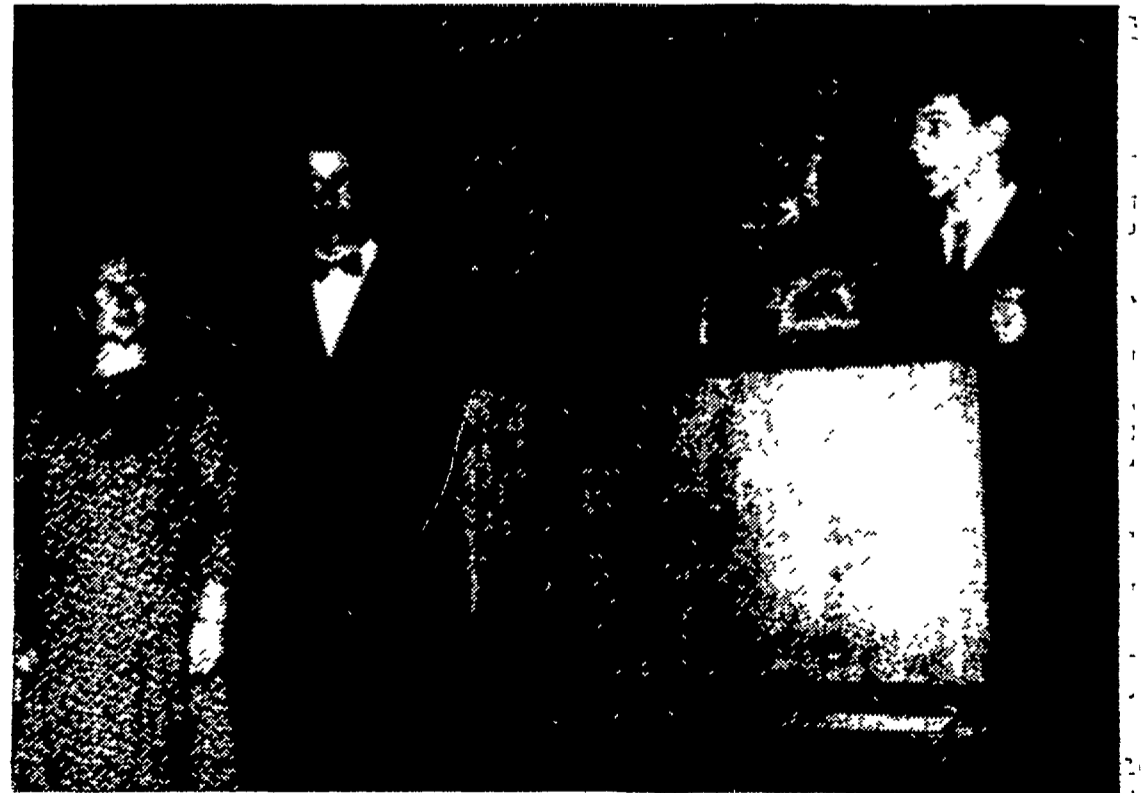
