Offerings generally short of full current interest, but increasing for later pickup as producers desire to move flocks as a result of the egg market decline. Heavy type offerings very short for a fairly good demand. Offerings from Delmarva adequate for local needs. Occasional movement of turkeys noted on heavy toms. Broiler and fryer live prices averaged 17.97 cents a pound this week. Prices ranged from a high of 19.1 cents a pound on Wednesday to a low of 17 cents a pound on Monday. Sales totaled 544,300 head down 154,000 from last week.

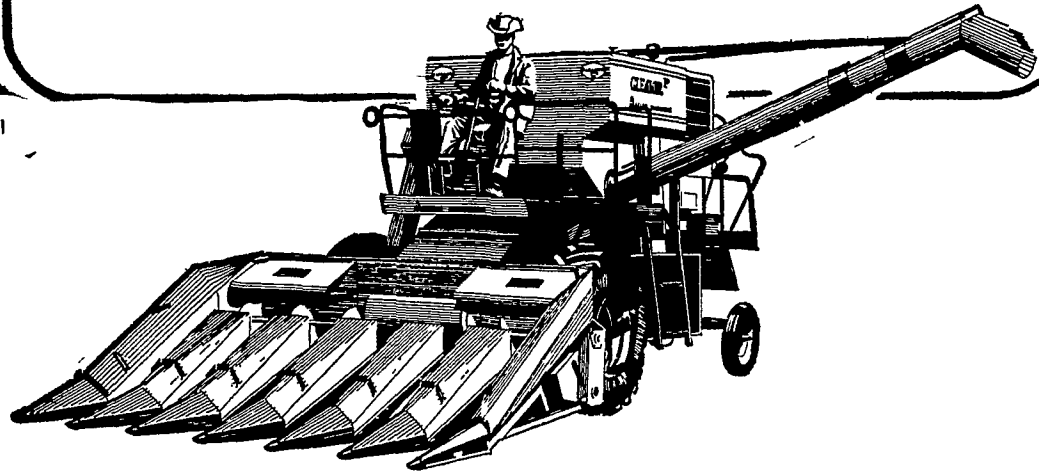

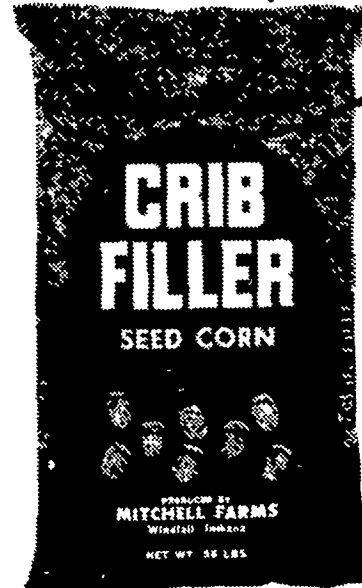
