ed speaker to the delegate body and guests at the Pennmarva Federation's first annual meeting. Senator Mathias urged dairy farmers to support the efforts of their new federation. The Maryland Senator cited the U. S. foreign policy as the key factor affecting all other programs under the new administration.

Senator Mathias was presented to the group by Edgar G. Emrich, president of the Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers.

Mr. Noiman, 1968 Pennmarva

president, presided over the first annual meeting of the Federation, which was officially organized July 1, 1968.

Included in the membership of the Federation of over 5,000 dairymen are members of Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative, Philadelphia, Pa.; Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers, Baltimore, Md.; and Maryland and Virginia Milk Producers' Association, Arlington, Va.

Included in the annual meeting program were reports from the general managers of the three federated cooperatives: Dr. James E. Hcnan, general

manager of Inter-State; Ralph L. Strock, general manager of the Maryland Cooperative; and James E. Click, general manager of the Maryland and Virginia Association.

In addition to the above reports, James Smathers of the Maryland and Virginia Milk Producers' Association, reported on a three-market milk quality study.

The newly formed federation of dairy farmers supported a three-point program to their senators and congressmen to consider action during the 1969 session of our U S Legislature. The Federation supported prompt action of their representatives in Congress in support of the "Dairy Import Act of 1969," designed to prevent dumping of low quality products by foreign countries.

The delegates requested their representatives to support two principal amendments to the Agricultural Marketing Agreement Act of 1937. The first is a modification of authority included in the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965 to enable cooperatives to establish the Class I Base Plan to established producers as well as new producers.

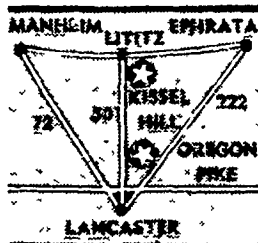
