Prices of light type hens held unchanged. Demand continues good with offerings short of needs as several processors continue to only work part time. Occasional flock of yearlings reported being recycled rather than move to slaughter. Heavy type hens generally short of a fairly good small lot interest. 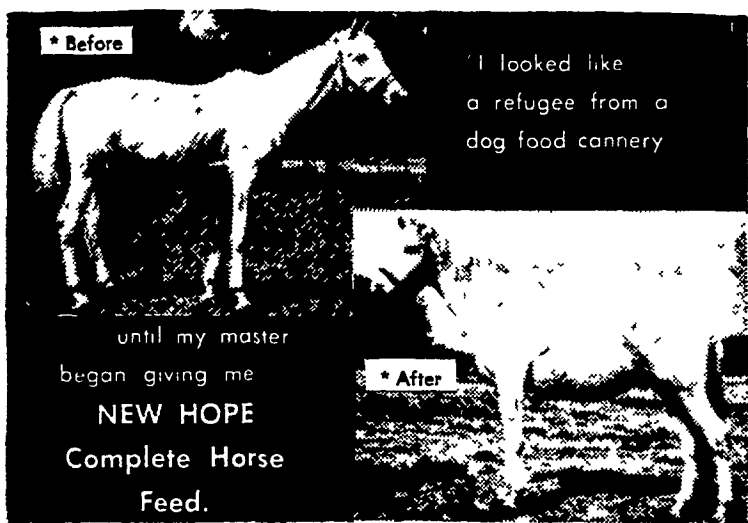
