

Farm Labor Camp Operators Must Have Proper Licensing

Farm labor camp operators and owners in Pennsylvania have been notified by the State Labor and Industry Department that under no circumstances will camps be allowed to operate this year without proper licensing.

John K. Tabor, State Secretary of Labor and Industry, said today that applications for registration certificates were mailed out last week along with letters spelling out the Commonwealth's new camp inspection procedure.

Tabor said each of the approximately 375 farm labor camps in Pennsylvania will be inspected at least 45 days prior to opening. Earlier inspections this year will allow ample time for operators to make changes or corrections to comply with State health and safety regulations.

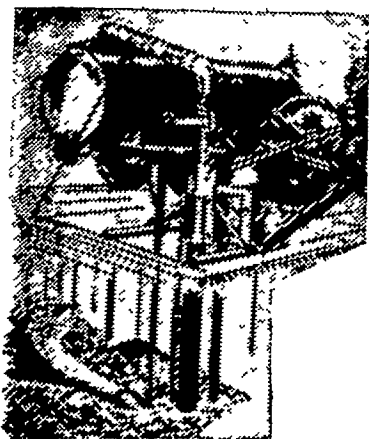

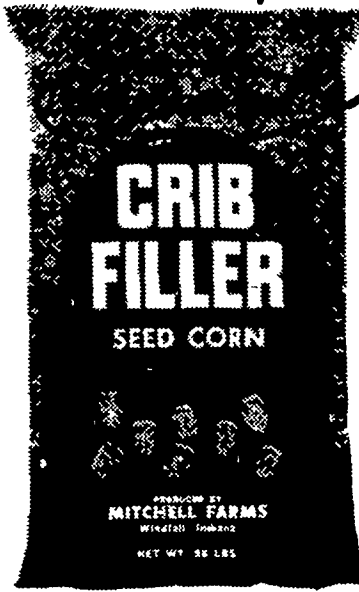
