

# Weekly Poultry Report

## Eastern Shore Exchange

Broiler and live layer prices averaged 1965 for the first three days of this week. Prices ranged from a high of 22 3 cents a pound on Wednesday to a low of 18 cents a pound also on Wednesday. Total sales for the three day period was 372,700 head. Last week the four day total was 542,400.

## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

Prices held unchanged on light type hens. Demand continued good in most sections as slaughter plants operated full time. Supplies were adequate and in instances, especially in New Jersey, were more freely offered as a result of further declines in the egg market. Considerable volume of birds in Pennsylvania were being offered for movement the week just ahead and the one following Easter as producers made plans for the future. Heavy type hens were offered sparingly and generally were short of full call.

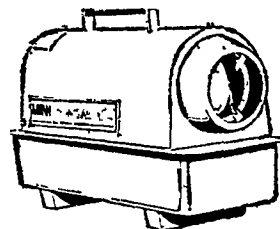
