CATTLE — Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers generally steady, some good to low choice weak to 25 lower, slaughter heifers steady, cows strong to 50 higher.

Local receipts 76 percent slaughter steers, 19 percent heifers and the balance mainly cows. Overall finish of slaughter steers not much different than a week ago with 11 percent prime and 75 percent choice. This compares with 12 percent
