Stir in the milk. Heat to serving temperature. Makes 6 servings. About 175 calories per serving

POTATO AND SPINACH SOUP

- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 cups water
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups raw, peeled, diced potatoes
- 2 cups chopped fresh spinach

- 1 1/2 cups (1 tall can) evaporated milk
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

In a large saucepan saute onion in butter until transparent. Add water, salt, potatoes and spinach. Cook until potatoes are tender, about 20 minutes. Add remaining ingredients and heat thoroughly but do not boil. Serve with shredded Cheddar, Provolone or Parmesan cheese for topping. Makes 6 servings.

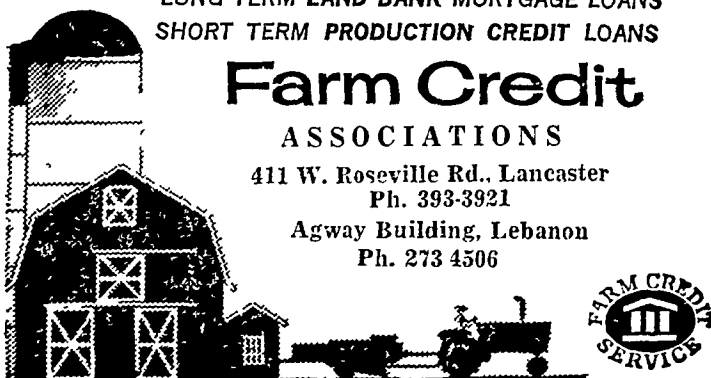

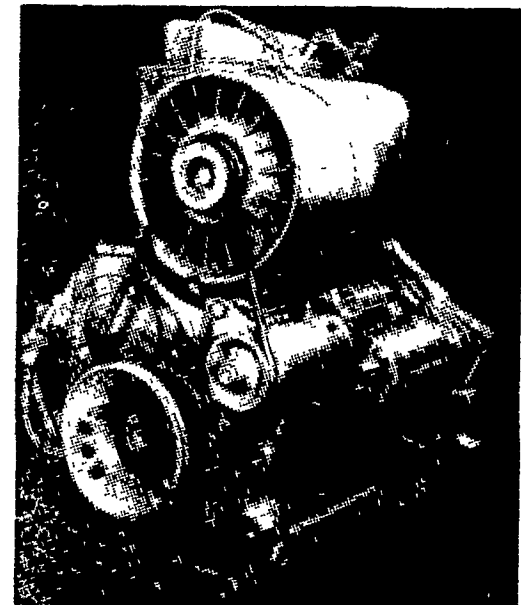
