spoons 3 inches apart on greased cooky sheet

Bake in very hot oven (450 degrees) 15 minutes, then in slow oven (325 degrees) 25 minutes. Remove from oven; split. Turn oven off and put cream puffs back in oven to dry out about 20 minutes. Cool on rack.

Just before serving, fill center with a double recipe of French Custard Filling. Replace tops. Makes 10 big puffs.

FRENCH CUSTARD FILLING

1/2 cup sugar
1 tablespoon enriched flour

1 tablespoon cornstarch
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups milk
1 beaten egg yolk
1 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 cup heavy cream, whipped
Combine sugar, flour, cornstarch and salt. Gradually stir in milk. Cook and stir until mixture thickens and boils; cook and stir 2 or 3 minutes longer. Stir a little of hot mixture into egg yolk, return to hot mixture. Stirring constantly bring just to boiling. Add vanilla. Cool. Fold in whipped cream.

Another hobby is knitting and

There is very much cleaning for Mrs Stauffer to do in these large buildings and she does an excellent job.

They are members of this church and Sunday School. Doti teaches 8th and 9th grade girls in the Sunday School, teaches at Daily Vacation Bible School, is a member of Circle #1 of the Women's Association and the last two years served as World Fellowship Chairman—in charge of sewing and mission work.

Mrs Stauffer is Republican Committee Woman for Drumore Township. They meet several times a year in Quarryville or Lancaster.

Mr and Mrs. Stauffer are members of Shoe-flyer Square Dance Club which has a membership of 40 and meets monthly in the home of Bert Wittenberg, Strasburg, who calls the figures and teaches square dancing. This group goes all out for dance outfits, and Doti made her dress combining two of her hobbies—dancing and sewing. In 1960 she and her husband took part in Fulton Grange's square dance team at the Pennsylvania Farm Show in Harrisburg and their team at the Pennsylvania Farm also completed in the Pennsylvania State Grange District square dance contest at the Owens J Roberts High School at Pottstown.

(Continued from Page 17) thriftiness (the pig's ability to gain weight rapidly and efficiently). Feeder pigs judged to lack thriftiness will grade U.S. Utility or Cull. Feeder pigs which are thrifty will be assigned one of the numerical grades.

Differences between the numerical grades are based entirely on differences in logical slaughter potential. For example, a U.S. No. 1 feeder pig must have sufficient muscling and frame to develop into a U.S. No. 1 slaughter hog, when it reaches a market weight of 220 pounds. A U.S. No. 1 slaughter hog is expected to produce a U.S. No. 1 carcass.
