Questionnaire Report

WASHINGTON — Congressman Edwin D. Eshleman today announced the results of the tally of his most recent questionnaire.

Eshleman said that over 2200 people from the 16th Congressional District had sent him responses to the 11 part questionnaire that he issued late in January. The Congressman also indicated that many respondents had commented on other issues of national concern, "particularly taxes."

The poll results shown by Congressman Eshleman were:

(1) Vietnam continues to be

our most serious foreign problem. Consider each of the following statements and check the one that most closely resembles your own opinion about U. S. policy.

(a) The United States should withdraw all of its troops from Vietnam and let South and North Vietnam settle the whole issue by themselves. Agree 12%.

(b) The United States should resume the bombing of North Vietnam and try to get a military settlement of the conflict. Agree 18%.

(c) The United States should

pursue a policy similar to the present one of limited fighting while negotiating. Agree 13%.

(d) The United States should assume a more forceful role in the Paris peace talks, but begin a gradual withdrawal of troops from Vietnam. Agree 18%.

(e) The United States should let South Vietnam do most of the talking in Paris, and also turn most of the fighting over to the South Vietnamese. Agree 9%.

(f) The United States should negotiate with the North Vietnamese strictly about questions involving troop withdrawals and let the South Vietnamese work out a political settlement with the Viet Cong. Agree 6%.

(g) None of the above, but my own thoughts as follows: Others 24%. Most comments in this category consisted of combinations of two or three of the six statements listed above.

(2) Some changes in Social Security are likely to be considered in the 91st Congress. Which one of the following proposals might you favor?

(a) Provide for automatic cost-of-living adjustments to Social Security benefits. Agree 51%.

(b) Increase benefits overall by 13 percent and raise the minimum amount received from \$55 a month to \$80. Agree 9%.

(c) Both of the above. Agree 23%.

(d) None of the above. Agree 17%.

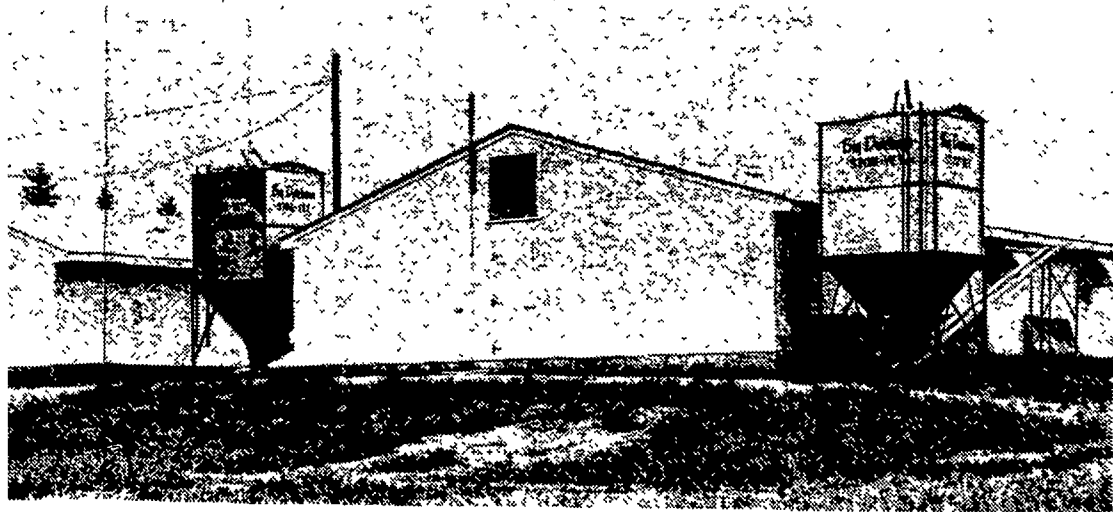
