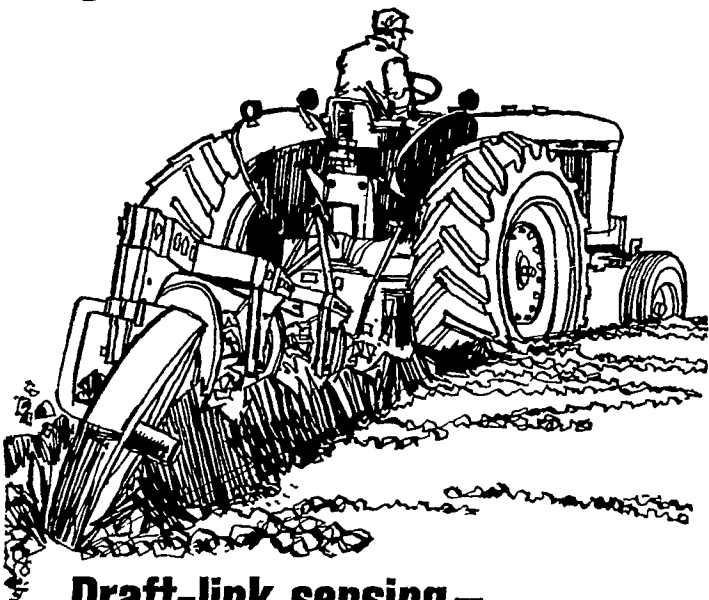
"You are urged to attend and learn about this proposed marketing program," Lueck said.
